Three (3) members of the Board constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Some items on the Agenda may be approved without any discussion.

The Board Secretary will announce the items to be considered by the Board. The Board will hear the presentation on the topic and gather additional information from Department Staff. Once presentations have finished, the Board President will ask if any Board Member or member of the public wishes to speak on one or more of these items. Each speaker called before the Commission will have one (1) minute to express their comments and concerns on matters placed on the agenda. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes.)

<u>PUBLIC INPUT AT BOARD MEETINGS</u> – Public Participation on Agenda Items. Members of the public will have an opportunity to address the Board on agenda items after the item is called and before the Board takes action on the item, unless the opportunity for public participation on the item was previously provided to all interested members of the public at a public meeting of a Committee of the Board and the item has not substantially changed since the Committee heard the item. When speaking to an agenda item other than during Public Comment (see Public Comment below), the speaker shall limit his or her comments to the specific item under consideration (California Government Code, Section 54954.3).

Public Comment. The Board will provide an opportunity for public comment at every regular meeting of the Board. Members of the public may address the Board on any items within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board as part of Public Comment.

Speaker Cards. Members of the public wishing to speak are to fill out one speaker card for each agenda item on which they wish to speak and present it to the Board secretary **before** the item is called.

Time Limit for Speakers. Speakers addressing the Board will be limited to one (1) minute of speaking time for each agenda item except during general public comment period which is limited to two (2) minutes per speaker. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes each.). The Chairperson, with the approval of a majority of the Board, may for good cause extend any speaker's time by increments of up to one (1) minute.

Brown Act. These rules shall be interpreted in a manner that is consistent with the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section § 54950 et seq.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT. Speakers are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from personal attacks or use of profanity or language that may incite violence.

All persons present at Board meetings are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from disrupting the meeting, interfering with the rights of others to address the Board and/or interfering with the conduct of business by the Board.

In the event that any speaker does not comply with the foregoing requirements, or if a speaker does not address the specific item under consideration, the speaker may be ruled out of order, their speaking time forfeited and the Chairperson may call upon the next speaker.

The Board, by majority vote, may order the removal from the meeting of any speaker or audience member continuing

to behave in a disruptive manner after being warned by the Chairperson regarding their behavior. Section 403 of the California Penal Code states as follows: "Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor."

<u>VOTING AND DISPOSITION OF ITEMS</u> — Most items require a majority vote of the entire membership of the Board (3 members). When debate on an item is completed, the Board President will instruct the Secretary to "call the roll". Every member present must vote for or against each item; abstentions are not permitted unless there is a Conflict of Interest for which the Board member is obliged to abstain from voting. The Secretary will announce the votes on each item. Any member of the Board may move to "reconsider" any vote on any item on the agenda, except to adjourn, suspend the Rules, or where an intervening event has deprived the Board of jurisdiction, providing that said member originally voted on the prevailing side of the item. The motion to "reconsider" shall only be in order once during the meeting, and once during the next regular meeting. The member requesting reconsideration shall identify for all members present the Agenda number and subject matter previously voted upon. A motion to reconsider is not debatable and shall require an affirmative vote of three members of the Board.

When the Board has failed by sufficient votes to approve or reject an item, and has not lost jurisdiction over the matter, or has not caused it to be continued beyond the next regular meeting, the issue is again placed on the next agenda for the following meeting for the purpose of allowing the Board to again vote on the matter.

David Zaft, President Larry Gross, Vice-President Olivia E. García Alana Yañez

Meeting called to order at 7:03 p.m. Commissioners present were Zaft, Gross, García and Yañez. (AGM) Dana Brown stated that Commissioner Wolfson and General Manager (GM) Brenda Barnette would arrive late. Also present from Los Angeles Animal Services (LAAS) (AGM) Derek Brown and (AGM) Dana Brown; and Assistant City Attorney (ACA) Dov Lesel.

Commissioner Zaft opened the meeting and provided an overview of the meeting agenda.

REGULAR COMMISSION MEETING

1. PUBLIC COMMENT

Frederick "Jordan" Jordan: Current ACO; openly gay and has been diagnosed with AIDS; shares his experience to help others; recited a poem he wrote. Martin Hochman: former Commissioner; lives where Western meets the ocean and has been seeing more coyotes in the daytime; commended Board for their service. Phyllis Daugherty: Mentioned the tragedies of Orlando and shooting of ACO in New Jersey; described incident in New Jersey; wanted us to remember how dangerous the ACOs job is; complained about ACE Program. Toni Robinson: Rescues dogs; lives in Harbor Gateway; complained about not being able to drop off strays at Carson or closet shelter. William Tranzow: Lieutenant for DAS: been with department for a couple of decades; thanked the Commission for coming to the Harbor; wanted to publicly welcome AGM Derek Brown back; said that it's a pleasure and honor to work with Derek. Commissioner Wolfson joined the meeting at 7:17 pm. Toni Martinovich: Identified herself as a San Pedro resident who works with low income and homeless populations: expressed desire to get spay/neuter vouchers for low income/homeless clients. Alex Gonzales: Spoke in behalf of Dean Funatsu; stated that Dean's absence is a loss to the animals. Michelle Kelly: Expressed concern about the summer heat in the shelters; rabbits at North Central are outside and too close to barking dogs; West Valley also has A/C problems; suggested that a shade cloth be added to the window at the Harbor shelter; stated that discounted and/or fostering rabbits is a bad idea; department doesn't have staff to oversee rabbit foster program. Barbara Trelease: West Los Angeles rabbit volunteer: discussed fostering rabbits. Verne Apperson: San Pedro resident: stated that coyote problem is bad; intimated that coyotes were the reason why her cat disappeared 10 days ago. Andrew Brown: Stated that the hold period for possible owner animals is too long and that the hold period negatively impacts dog behaviors; asked department to do a study on possible owner animals'

redemptions versus strays. **Jeff Fleiss:** Co-founder of Watts Project (a small rescue organization) spoke on Dean Funatsu's positive impact on the animals. **Ayana Garcia:** South Los Angeles volunteer who requested the reinstatement of Dean Funatsu; Dean mentored her for two years; she now feels comfortable interacting with all breeds including pit bulls. **Cornelius Austin:** Requested that Dean Funatsu be reinstated. **Vania Hidalgo:** Spoke highly of Dean Funatsu on behalf of Lori Weiss, DDR. **Starr Urias:** ACT at South Los Angeles; begged for Dean Funatsu's reinstatement. **Dean Funatsu:** Asked to be reconsidered for reinstatement; said that he was never told why he was terminated; had many letters of reference.

2. NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL COMMENTS -

 ACA Dov Lesel clarified that the Neighborhood Council comments have to be regarding an item that has been formerly adopted and is on the agenda. Otherwise, it is simply a public comment. Peter Burmeister from the San Pedro Neighborhood Council wanted to thank commission for coming to San Pedro; commented that he's been hearing good things from the community.

3. COMMISSION BUSINESS

A. Approval of Minutes for May 24, 2016

Commissioner Gross motioned to accept. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded the motion. Approved 5-0-1

Public Comment None

4. ORAL REPORT OF THE MANAGER (Public comment limited to one minute per speaker). GM Barnette greeted all and said she had just arrived from attending a LGBT event sponsored by the Mayor.

GM Barnette discussed the following:

- ASPCA Final Report for the \$400,000 grant funds statistics.
- South Park Elementary School Career Day went well.
- Final Strategic Planning Community meeting held on May 31, 2016.
- New pet segment with Telemundo in the 4th week.
- Rescue organization used the North Central Shelter to train their volunteers on June 2, 2016.
- Statistics show a decrease in the intake of pit bulls in the shelters for the fiscal years since 2011-2012 as follows: 2011-2012 20.36%, 2012-2013 19.86%, 2013-2014 18.50%, 2014-2015 17.19%, 2015-2016 16.73%
- Wildlife Season; field staff very busy

5. COMMISSIONERS' ORAL REPORTS AND FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Commissioner Wolfson: Mentioned working with City Attorney, CAO and LAAS staff regarding the possible installation of kiosks in the shelters; looking forward to information from City Attorney on Gift Policy; looking forward to discussion regarding changing shelter hours; examining adoption fees; considering reducing all hold periods; wants to know more about Dean Funatsu termination; interested in getting a mediator for volunteers and staff. Commissioner Garcia: Requested report on shelter intervention program and managed intake; concerned about Dean Funatsu's discharge. Commissioner Yanez: Expressed concern about the pricing of technology that will enable canvassers to print vouchers at the door; requested report concerning documents canvassers are distributing. Commissioner Gross: Attended 15th strategic planning meeting held in Highland Park and was impressed with the turn out; talked about NKLA adoption event at Griffith Park that exceeded their goal with over 500 adoptions.

Public Comment None

6. BOARD REPORTS

A. Animal Welfare Trust and Animal Sterilization Fund Balance (Public comment limited to one minute per speaker.

Commissioner Zaft: Suggested that we start by discussing Animal Sterilization Fund Report. GM Barnette: Mentioned that questions should be entertained. Commissioner Gross: Inquired about grants and the contract agencies and the totals since only two months are left in the fiscal year. Mentioned lag time in the billing. GM Barnette: Stated that the contract administrator is working with Dov to change the language in the some of the contracts and negotiating stringently; answered questions about donation total for the month, mentioned that Lilia Liclican can come to the meeting to answer more specific questions regarding donations. Commissioner Gross: Asked about WLA/Harbor Shelter renovation expenditure. Commissioner Yanez: Questioned whether bunnies can be moved inside during NOC renovations. Commissioner Zaft: Voiced his desire to add an agenda item to discuss having rabbits at all the shelters.

Public Comments

Frederick "Jordan" Jordan: Suggested using SMART Team office to house rabbits; declared that the ASPCA should operate all of our spay/neuter clinics.

B. Woofstat Report for April 2016

GM Barnette discussed:

- Doing well but numbers of kittens have significantly increased
- Running ahead of schedule for Live/Save rates
- Licensing still up overall
- Overall euthanasia is down
- Volunteers and volunteer's hours are up. Need to make sure volunteers sign in where they work

Commissioner Wolfson: Stated that we should proceed with volunteer appreciation

event planning. **GM Barnette:** Expressed concerns over event planning to due staffing limitations. **Commissioner Zaft:** Pleased with euthanasia numbers; much better than the 20,000 animals of five years ago; specifically wanted to thank the ACOs, the vets and the vet techs that work each day to reduce the euthanasia numbers; thanked personnel at San Pedro shelter also for the shelter's great numbers.

Public Comment

Phyllis Daugherty: Vets shouldn't need to spay/neuter since we have so many contractors; vets should focus more on animal care inside the various animal shelters; elaborated on a ACE citation incident; asked for the number of D300's or animals that have not been spayed/neutered that are given to rescue organizations. Martin Hochman: Asked about a report from Best Friends and New Hope Partners regarding the final placement of the animals put in their care. Commissioner Zaft: Responded that reports on the placement of each animal are provided to DAS from the rescue organizations. GM Barnette: Stated that placement reports are not released to the public; revealed that animals are not normally given to rescue organizations that are not spayed and neutered unless they are less than eight weeks old.

7. Proposal from Commissioner Wolfson to Encourage More People to Foster by Awarding Foster Volunteers a Percentage of Adoption Fees If They Successfully Place the Shelter Animal in a Home That Is Not Their Own (Public comment limited to one minute per speaker).

Commissioner Wolfson: Discussed his vision of promoting the foster program and shifting savings to foster volunteers as a reward to encourage participation. GM Barnette: Offered her input based on her experience; stated that what foster parents want most is an accessible vet to have their animals checked out and suggested streamlining the adoption process; stated that monetary incentives might not be the most effective solution; said that volunteers would appreciate items like "Adopt Me" jackets. Commissioner Yanez: Offered suggestion of providing food for the animals instead of money. Commissioner Zaft: Asked for City Attorney's input. Commissioner Wolfson: Asked to hear from the community regarding the matter.

Public Comment

Martin Hochman: Declared that monetary incentive may attract people for the wrong reason. Phyllis Daugherty: Commented that adoption fees are tax dollars and can't be given away. Andrew Brown: Suggested that the best incentive to encourage fostering would be to make the fostering process easier. AGM Dana Brown: Mentioned new directives regarding fosters. Commissioner Wolfson: Requested a report on the next meeting agenda.

C. ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Wolfson made a motion to adjourn the meeting in honor of the shooting victims in Orlando and the entire LGBT community worldwide. **Commissioner Zaft** seconded motion. Motion passed 5 - 0.

SUBJECT: STATUS OF RABBIT FACILITIES AT VARIOUS SHELTERS AND

RECOMMENDATION TO USE MONEY FROM ANIMAL WELFARE

TRUST FUND TO PAY FOR IMPROVEMENTS

BOARD ACTION RECOMMENDED:

 APPROVE proposed request for use of \$18,000 from the Animal Welfare Trust Fund monies for necessary alterations and improvements to our rabbit keeping areas for both immediate and future use.

SUMMARY

The Department would like to thank Michelle Kelley, Licensed Educator for the House Rabbit Society for taking the time to visit all of our shelters and provide her expertise and recommendations for better rabbit housing. In Ms. Kelley's assessment she identifies immediate recommendations for three of the Departments six shelters. Ms. Kelley's long term recommended alterations and improvements will provide better housing for rabbits while promoting adoptions and bringing in potential volunteers.

Harbor: Install an additional awning/canopy outside of the rabbit keeping area at our Harbor location. The addition of this awning/canopy help aid in providing additional shade to the room in hopes to allow the Air Conditioning (AC) unit to operate optimally. Currently the shelter staff and volunteers are using blankets/sheets to provide additional shade from the sun piercing through the window. These blankets/sheets lined along side of the cages are unsightly and could cause a potential health risk to the rabbits should they ingest the linen. The estimated cost for the addition of an awning is \$3,612.96.

North: Move the rabbits into the building during the hot summer months. Various locations within the building are being assessed with two potential rooms in mind; however the Department will be required to purchase equipment necessary for housing rabbits in the new location. Items the Department is requesting approval to purchase include (1) portable AC unit for an estimated \$850.14 as well as the purchase of (9) banks of stainless steel modular cages at an estimated cost of \$1,309.52 per unit totaling \$11,782.71. Each bank of stainless steel modular cages provides cage space for six rabbits and when needed allows bonded rabbits more room to roam. The purchase of (9) of these cage banks will allow the Department to increase the overall holding capacity by (26) rabbits by providing an overall total of (54) single cages or (27) bonded animal cages. The total estimated amount requested for approval is \$12,632.85.

West Valley: Recommendations for our West Valley facility will have to be broken into two phases.

- Phase I-- Purchase of (1) portable AC unit at an estimated cost of \$850.14.
- Phase II—Cost are not available and will require the Department to draft a scope of work required to meet the Departments needs along with Ms. Kelley's recommendations for the necessary modifications to this room. Once the Department has drafted a scope of work management team members will need to request a job walk with the City's Department of General Services Construction Forces Division in order to obtain cost estimates after which the Department will issue a request for proposal for modifications in this area. Recommendations for Phase II may include, but not be limited to, items such as some type of additional overhead cooling material be added to the roof top or ceiling and/or exhaust fan(s) to aid in keeping the room cooler along with the replacement of the current Air Conditioning unit with a larger energy efficient one, the current cages be replaced with a more modern cage designed for long term housing along with the removal/replacement of the wrought iron window with a store front type window and the back fill of the current trench drain system. Cost estimates are not available at this time.
