AGENDAS - The Board of Animal Services Commissioners (Board) meets regularly every second (2nd) and fourth (4th) Tuesday of each month at 10:00 A.M. Regular Meetings are held at City Hall, 200 North Spring Street, Room 1060, in Los Angeles, CA 90012. Evening Meetings are held in various locations throughout the City, from 7:00 to approximately 9:30 P.M. The agendas for Board meetings contain a brief general description of those items to be considered at the meetings. Board Agendas are available at the Department of Animal Services (Department), Administrative Division, 221 North Figueroa Street, 6th Floor, Suite 600, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Board Agendas may also be viewed on the 2nd floor Public Bulletin Board in City Hall East, 200 North Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Internet users may also access copies of present and prior agenda items, copies of the Board Calendar, MP-

3 audio files of meetings as well as electronic copies of approved minutes on the Department's World Wide Web Home Page site at <http://www.laanimalservices.com/CommissionAgendas.htm>

Three (3) members of the Board constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Some items on the Agenda may be approved without any discussion.

The Board Secretary will announce the items to be considered by the Board. The Board will hear the presentation on the topic and gather additional information from Department Staff. Once presentations have finished, the Board President will ask if any Board Member or member of the public wishes to speak on one or more of these items. Each speaker called before the Commission will have one (1) minute to express their comments and concerns on matters placed on the agenda. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes.)

PUBLIC INPUT AT BOARD MEETINGS – **Public Participation on Agenda Items.** Members of the public will have an opportunity to address the Board on agenda items after the item is called and before the Board takes action on the item, unless the opportunity for public participation on the item was previously provided to all interested members of the public at a public meeting of a Committee of the Board and the item has not substantially changed since the Committee heard the item. When speaking to an agenda item other than during Public Comment (see Public Comment below), the speaker shall limit his or her comments to the specific item under consideration (California Government Code, Section 54954.3).

Public Comment. The Board will provide an opportunity for public comment at every regular meeting of the Board. Members of the public may address the Board on any items within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board as part of Public Comment.

Speaker Cards. Members of the public wishing to speak are to fill out one speaker card for each agenda item on which they wish to speak and present it to the Board secretary **before** the item is called.

Time Limit for Speakers. Speakers addressing the Board will be limited to one (1) minute of speaking time for each agenda item except during general public comment period which is limited to two (2) minutes per speaker. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes each.). The Chairperson, with the approval of a majority of the Board, may for good cause extend any speaker's time by increments of up to one (1) minute.

Brown Act. These rules shall be interpreted in a manner that is consistent with the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section § 54950 et seq.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT. Speakers are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from personal attacks or use of profanity or language that may incite violence.

All persons present at Board meetings are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from disrupting the meeting, interfering with the rights of others to address the Board and/or interfering with the conduct of business by the Board.

In the event that any speaker does not comply with the foregoing requirements, or if a speaker does not address the specific item under consideration, the speaker may be ruled out of order, their speaking time forfeited and the Chairperson may call upon the next speaker.

The Board, by majority vote, may order the removal from the meeting of any speaker or audience member continuing to behave in a disruptive manner after being warned by the Chairperson regarding their behavior. Section 403 of the California Penal Code states as follows: "Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor."

VOTING AND DISPOSITION OF ITEMS – Most items require a majority vote of the entire membership of the Board (3 members). When debate on an item is completed, the Board President will instruct the Secretary to "call the roll". Every member present must vote for or against each item; abstentions are not permitted unless there is a Conflict of Interest for which the Board member is obliged to abstain from voting. The Secretary will announce the votes on each item. Any member of the Board may move to "reconsider" any vote on any item on the agenda, except to adjourn, suspend the Rules, or where an intervening event has deprived the Board of jurisdiction, providing that said member originally voted on the prevailing side of the item. The motion to "reconsider" shall only be in order once during the meeting, and once during the next regular meeting. The member requesting reconsideration shall identify for all members present the Agenda number and subject matter previously voted upon. A motion to reconsider is not debatable and shall require an affirmative vote of three members of the Board.

When the Board has failed by sufficient votes to approve or reject an item, and has not lost jurisdiction over the matter, or has not caused it to be continued beyond the next regular meeting, the issue is again placed on the next agenda for the following meeting for the purpose of allowing the Board to again vote on the matter.

Meeting called to order at 10:10 a.m. Commissioners present were Zaft, García, Gross, and Wolfson (not present). Also present from Los Angeles Animal Services (LAAS) Board Secretary Regina Gallegos; General Manager (GM) Brenda Barnette, Assistant General Manager (AGM) Dana Brown; and Assistant City Attorney (ACA) Dov Lesel.

Commissioner Zaft opened the meeting and provided an overview of the meeting agenda. **Commissioner Gross** discussed the appeal hearing process and conducted the hearings.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS

1. Dangerous Animal Revocation Case: DR 162143 EV

Respondent: Doris McClerkin and Malvin McClerkin
East Valley Animal Care and Control: Captain Karen Knipscheer-Cox
Complaining Witness: Alma Guerrero (*taken out of order after item 3.A.*)

The Respondents were not present. Complaining Witness provided a statement that her daughter was bit by the Respondents dog; concern that this doesn't happen to another person; daughter is still traumatized. Complaining Witness agrees with the Department's decision. **Commissioner Zaft** asked if Ms. Guerrero's daughter was the only witness during her injury. **Commissioner Gross** stated that Respondents didn't contest that the incident took place. Respondents allowed Ms. Guerrero's daughter to pet their dog. **Commissioner Gross** stated clearly there is an issue with the owner to control their dog; not sure if Dangerous Animal is the case; hard to determine the extent of the dog's aggression. **Commissioner Zaft** asked when record is not complete if possible to remand to the hearing officer to cover applicable factors and analyze in Dangerous Animal Cases. **ACA Lesel** recommended Commissioners to continue at next meeting and have staff provide Commissioners with a copy of the prior hearing and analysis.

Commissioner Zaft motioned to continue appeal hearing for next meeting on November 8th 2016; asked the Department to have the hearing officer prepare a supplemental report analyzing the factors of section (53.34.4 Sub C).

Commissioner Garcia seconded the motion and was approved by a vote of 3-0.

2. Dangerous Animal Revocation Case: DR 156018 EV

Respondent: Anthony Rey Lopez and Michelle Lee Oliveros Rey
East Valley Animal Care and Control: Captain Karen Knipscheer-Cox
Complaining Witness: East Valley Animal Care and Control
East Valley Animal Care and Control (*taken out of order after item 6.C*)

The Respondents Rey Lopez and Michelle Lee Oliveros along with their Attorney Michael T. Ungar appeared before the Commission. **Attorney** stated that the description of the dog is not that of his client. **Commissioner Zaft** stated there were terms and conditions for three dogs; no appeal from the Respondents. The determination was based on terms and conditions were not met. **Attorney** the Respondents three dogs were not involved in the incident; they have done no damage. **Commissioner Gross** at the previous hearing terms and conditions were set forth; additional time was given to the Respondents; they haven't complied. The hearing officer stated that the Respondents do not take the terms and conditions seriously. **Respondents** stated that all terms were met but missed the deadline; didn't have time for dog training. These are family dogs that stay indoors. **Commissioner Zaft** stated that the terms and conditions were issued and not challenged at the time. The Respondents need to comply without exception. **Commissioner Garcia** not aware what happened previously and why terms and conditions were set forth for all three dogs; Respondents are providing them with a home. **Commissioner Zaft** stated that if Respondents comply with the remaining terms and conditions within 30 days licenses may be reinstated. **Commissioner Gross** stated reluctant with this case due to the hearing officer's strong statements. **AGM Dana Brown** informed the Respondents to contact the field supervisor regarding the terms and conditions; information is updated in the system.

Commissioner Zaft: motioned to continue appeal hearing for the next meeting on November 8, 2016; Respondents are to comply with terms and conditions and provide proof to the Department prior to the meeting.

Commissioner Garcia seconded the motion and was approved by a vote of 3-0.

II. REGULAR COMMISSION MEETING

1. PUBLIC COMMENT

Phyllis Daugherty: Stated sent a letter to Commissioners about tethering; nothing worse than tethering dogs in yards; this is all over the United States; violation of State Law; this will help dog fighters and breeders; need to help the animals and keep them from danger.

- A. Approval of the minutes for the meeting of October 11, 2016. **Commissioner Gross** made a motion to approve the minutes. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded the motion and was approved by a vote of 3-0.

Commissioner Garcia: Attended The Michelson Found Animal Foundation; had a great time. Commissioner Zaft presented an award.

Commissioner Zaft: Attended the Michelson Found Animal Foundation. Senator Booker received an award; additional award recipients: Halo Dog Food Company and Best Friends.

Commissioner Gross: A reminder of the Pet Housing Workshop; urges everyone to attend; flyers are provided at the public desk. In addition, the East Valley Shelter and West Valley Shelter will be at Sherman Oaks Street Fair.

6. **BOARD REPORTS**

- A. Staff Report Requesting approval to amend the Requirements to obtain a license and microchip. (Action Item; Public comment limited to two minutes per speaker): (*taken out of order after 6.B*)

AGM Brown informed the Commission that the Department is the lead agency to assist homeless individuals and their pets to be compliance with the licensing and microchips. The Department is requesting approval for a change in the policy. Currently, LAAS policy requires animal licenses and microchipping to be processed with a physical address. **ACA Lesel** stated there are many requirements needed for licenses and one of them is a physical address; this creates a problem since most homeless people don't have a physical address; suggested to continue this issue and report back to

the Commission on alternatives. **Commissioner Gross** thanked the Department for bringing this forward since this is an important issue; concerns under the State Law; insuring how we can confirm eligible people; to prevent fraud. **GM Barnette** mentioned more studying needs to be done. **AGM Brown** will address more about this issue on a report; as a starting point to press for services at the Homeless Centers.

Public Comment:

Eric Deardorff: from PETA mentioned that they received a report on tethering dogs; tethering dogs are dangerous when left alone; they can be stolen or attacked by other dogs. Please keep in mind this happens in minutes not in hours. It is important to always have dogs supervised; LAAS website highlighted on tethered dogs.

Phyllis Daugherty: mentioned there cannot be two sets of laws. Homeless Encampments are not a life for animals; animals need proof of ownership before licensing. These are owners lost pets; homeless sell them. A Beagle fell from a shopping cart and kids sold it. This is not Social Services Department; this is to provide welfare to animals; not for homeless. There should be strict requirements for homeless to have possession of animals to include legal ownership and physical address such as any other dog owner in the City.

- B.** Staff Report Requesting approval for the use of Animal Welfare Trust Funds monies to cover the additional costs associated with retrofitting space at our West Los Angeles and Harbor Facilities. (Action Item; Public comment limited to two minutes per speaker): *(taken out of order before 6.A)*

ACT Christy Louzon stated General Services met with Yates X-Ray Services and found electrical requirements varied; as a result additional costs are required for retrofitting space at West Los Angeles and Harbor facilities. **Commissioner Gross** mentioned concern regarding the delay brought forth to the Commission; it has been over a year. **ACT Louzon** stated it was a delay with General Services providing the Department with an estimate.

Commissioner Gross: Motioned to approve request for additional funds for electrical issues. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded the motion. Approved 3-0.

Public Comment

- C.** Oral Staff Report on Kapparat (Public comment limited to one minute per speaker): *(taken out of order after 6.A)*

DFO Salazar stated that he provided staff with Humane Calls Information Sheets regarding Kapparat ritual celebrated October 5-11.

- An animal cruelty crimes press release on October 5th -10th which provides information on how to report animal cruelty. Calls started on October 4th.
- On October 5th received a call for possible dead chicken in the alley and a possible ritual; ACO responded and didn't find any violation; made contact with the resident; scheduled another ACO officer for later that day the officer observed chickens on the property and issued an administrative citation to the owner.
- On October 6th concerns about chickens being delivered on the 200 block of North Palms in Beverly Hills; no chickens observed
- On October 9th department was advised of protesting activity on the 19800 block of Ventura Blvd; LAPD on location; no calls for ACO for assistance.
- On October 10th same complaint ; one person arrested by LAPD.
- On October 11th concern on welfare check for chickens on 100 Block of North Virgil an ACO was dispatched. This was a poultry facility providing Kapparot ritual; no violations on the property.

Commissioner Gross asked DFO Salazar if there were calls about the Hebrew Center located in Woodlands Hills. **DFO Salazar** stated staff was under instruction; there were no calls. **Commissioner Gross** mentioned at the L.A. Poultry Company people who purchased chickens were shoving them in boxes. **DFO Salazar** stated no ACOs observed this. **Rabbi** spoke on behalf of the welfare of the chickens; thanked the Commission for putting Kapparot on the agenda; would be happy to sit with the Commission individually to discuss Kapparot. LAPD and LAAS were not in communication with each other; was hoping for better communication. LA Sanitation dead animal truck showed up on the scene twice to pick up dead chickens; people are not caring about the chickens. The community is saying it's being used for food and it is not; LAAS can do more on this. **Commissioner Gross** asked if the Council or Mayor Office were called. **Rabbi** responded that the Council Office was called however; would like further conversation throughout the year; LAAS can do more. **Commissioner Zaft** asked about coordination last year. **Rabbi** responded there was more action by LAAS last year. **Commissioner Gross** stated that based on the video it appeared LAPD was there protecting private property. It seemed as if LAPD was put into a situation in which they had no idea as to what was going on. **Commissioner Garcia** asked how LAAS services can assist for next year. **Rabbi** responded would like to coordinate throughout the year and re-establish line of communication. **Commissioner Gross** mentioned three major cities in Israel which have abandoned Kapparot ritual. We need to strive to take a progressive stand on this issue. **Lisa Karlan** from Jewish Animal Welfare Organization stated they promote Kapparot with coins; read on the Penal Code (597a) on Cruelty to animals/ Transporting animals in a cruel manner; why didn't LAAS send out ACOs to Woodland Hills; LAPD did not maintain their composure; spoke to LAPD Commander. **Rabbi** would like to see the following from LAAS

next year; proactive press advisory; recognition of Penal Code (597a); task force with LAAS; points of relationship with the City; inter-departmental communication.

Public Comment:

Sarah Hardt: stated that she has not slept in days; this was a bad experience with Kapparot; thanked LAAS for showing up without calling. It was a bad experience in Woodland Hills and made repeated calls to LAAS 24 hour number but there was no answer; would like more cooperation with LAPD & LAAS.

Cory Mac: stated an advocate named Lola is in jail; this will continue to get worse; we are not going away ; hope LAAS is there next year; LAAS should attend a protest.

Dr. Sherstin Rosenberg: stated she is a veterinarian speaking from the bird perspective. When birds are transported to slaughter calcium is leaked from their bones; they are being shoved in boxes; this cannot be allowed; this is inhumane.

Jeff Fleiss: mentioned this was first year at event. This is very shameful with the City and general public. This is happening underground; Kapparot ritual taking place on Pico Blvd and in the valley area; chickens were picked up as trash from the City; Police were out of control.

Katherine Magen: mentioned proud to be Jewish. Approached Rabbi Louie and asked if he would accept money for the chicken; Rabbi Louie hired security; described conditions of the chickens; if this has to happen it should take place in a slaughter house.

Phyllis Daugherty: stated LAAS had many meeting on this issue and nothing was done. There was only one chicken seized. LAPD Animal Cruelty Task Force should have been present. The Mayor is spending 800,000 on a cat study but did nothing to stop this.

Zoe Rosenberg: showed a picture of a chicken rescued in 2014 from Kapparot ritual. The chicken's leg was broken and in pain. The law is not being enforced; this has to stop; it's horrible.

Commissioner Zaft thanked all public speakers on this issue; open to meet in the coming weeks. **Commissioner Gross** mentioned in last meeting if LAAS was ready and in place to respond to Kapparot. **DFO Salazar** responded that LAPD was in Woodland Hills due to activity. LAAS did not dispatch ACOs; we are open to improve relationships with Council and with other departments. We will embrace to continue discussions; we were well prepared; staff has been extremely responsive. The Department will look into the phone system. **Commissioner Gross** we need to plan out a strategy for next year; we can do

better. It is a challenge with laws and jurisdiction.

D. Oral Staff Report on Strategy for Responding to Current Influx of Kittens
(Public comment limited to one minute per speaker):

GM Barnette reported on the current Influx of Kittens. This information is on LAAS website.

- Even though more kittens have come in this year 1,100 fewer kittens have been killed in 2016 vs. 2015 through September (calendar year), and over 3,200 fewer then the same period in 2011. Benchmark: Preliminary Aug 1-15 Stats: Save Rate for Cats 66.7%, Dogs 90.6%, and Kittens 66.5%. Combine save rate 1st half of August = 78.6% (3.2% increase over Aug ly). NKLA members have pulled over 900 underage kittens from LAAS to date and Best Friends has pulled over 2,200. We will take well over 2,600 and NKLA rescues over 1,200 underage kittens this year.
- Roughly \$100,000 remains of the ASPCA grant money for fee waived cat adoptions to the public. The Department will end the free cats, Pit Bulls and Chihuahuas to our New Hope Rescue Partners on September 30, 2016, and focus on public adoptions of cats. We will announce another adoption promotion for cats and kittens to begin on National Cat Day, October 29, 2016.
- On September 30th the Department distributed a press release urgently asking for foster volunteers to help care for underage kittens. Kitten season typically goes from April through September but this year we are continuing to receive kittens into October. We received media coverage from LA Weekly, Time Out LA, KFI News, CBSLA.com and NBCLA.com. West Valley Animal Shelter will be featured two of our kittens for the "Clear the Shelters" segment airing on Thursday October 6th. "Boomer" and "Brady"
- Safe At Home Program at South Chesterfield Square: We do get information on where the kittens come from with at least our safe at home person at South, and most do come from people finding them outside.
- Best Friends has committed 1.460M toward saving cats through grants given to NKLA rescue groups providing nurseries, spay and neuter, adoption incentives and operation grants in 2017 because of our partnership with the city focusing on the cat issue. We will also spend about 6M in addition in hopes we continue the operation of Mission Hill's as well as the NKLA center.

Commissioner Zaft interested in hearing about long term strategy with the Department regarding the injunction; explanation of the injunction; schedule injunction as an item on the agenda; asked about monies that were approved in the budget for environmental review. **GM Barnette** responded there are 800,000 in the EIR. **Commissioner Garcia** asked about plans in expanding

the Safe at Home Program to other shelters. **GM Barnette** LAAS would like to expand; we are in the process of searching for a volunteer coordinator which will help in these types of programs. **Commissioner Gross** stated that Marc Peralta from Best Friends was unable to stay and for the item; however he sent an email to everyone on the issues.

Public Comment:

Vince Wong: from Found Animals Foundation stated how important to move forward with the EIR monies; it was a challenge to get the monies allocated.

Phyllis Daugherty: read from The California Legislature on “No Kill” section (1834.4.(a). the law does not intend that people make money on these little animals; this has turned into a money maker; we don’t have any licensing or microchipping on cats; need mandatory spay/neuter on owned animals; there are no restrictions on cats.

Commissioner Zaft mentioned on future presentation on injunction would like to be informed on where the cats are coming from; General Manager Barnett’s oral report to be rescheduled.

Commissioner Gross motioned to adjourn the meeting. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded the motion and was approved by a vote of 3-0.
