AGENDAS - The Board of Animal Services Commissioners (Board) meets regularly every second (2nd) and fourth (4th) Tuesday of each month at 10:00 A.M. Regular Meetings are held at City Hall, 200 North Spring Street, Room 1060, in Los Angeles, CA 90012. Evening Meetings are held in various locations throughout the City, from 7:00 to approximately 9:30 P.M. The agendas for Board meetings contain a brief general description of those items to be considered at the meetings. Board Agendas are available at the Department of Animal Services (Department), Administrative Division, 221 North Figueroa Street, 6th Floor, Suite 600, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Board Agendas may also be viewed on the 2nd floor Public Bulletin Board in City Hall East, 200 North Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Internet users may also access copies of present and prior agenda items, copies of the Board Calendar, MP-3 audio files of meetings as well as electronic copies of approved minutes on the Department's World Wide Web Home Page site at <http://www.laanimalservices.com/CommissionAgendas.htm>

Three (3) members of the Board constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Some items on the Agenda may be approved without any discussion.

The Board Secretary will announce the items to be considered by the Board. The Board will hear the presentation on the topic and gather additional information from Department Staff. Once presentations have finished, the Board President will ask if any Board Member or member of the public wishes to speak on one or more of these items. Each

speaker called before the Commission will have one (1) minute to express their comments and concerns on matters placed on the agenda. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes.)

PUBLIC INPUT AT BOARD MEETINGS – **Public Participation on Agenda Items.** Members of the public will have an opportunity to address the Board on agenda items after the item is called and before the Board takes action on the item, unless the opportunity for public participation on the item was previously provided to all interested members of the public at a public meeting of a Committee of the Board and the item has not substantially changed since the Committee heard the item. When speaking to an agenda item other than during Public Comment (see Public Comment below), the speaker shall limit his or her comments to the specific item under consideration (California Government Code, Section 54954.3).

Public Comment. The Board will provide an opportunity for public comment at every regular meeting of the Board. Members of the public may address the Board on any items within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board as part of Public Comment.

Speaker Cards. Members of the public wishing to speak are to fill out one speaker card for each agenda item on which they wish to speak and present it to the Board secretary **before** the item is called.

Time Limit for Speakers. Speakers addressing the Board will be limited to one (1) minute of speaking time for each agenda item except during general public comment period which is limited to two (2) minutes per speaker. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes each.). The Chairperson, with the approval of a majority of the Board, may for good cause extend any speaker's time by increments of up to one (1) minute.

Brown Act. These rules shall be interpreted in a manner that is consistent with the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section § 54950 et seq.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT. Speakers are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from personal attacks or use of profanity or language that may incite violence.

All persons present at Board meetings are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from disrupting the meeting, interfering with the rights of others to address the Board and/or interfering with the conduct of business by the Board.

In the event that any speaker does not comply with the foregoing requirements, or if a speaker does not address the specific item under consideration, the speaker may be ruled out of order, their speaking time forfeited and the Chairperson may call upon the next speaker.

The Board, by majority vote, may order the removal from the meeting of any speaker or audience member continuing to behave in a disruptive manner after being warned by the Chairperson regarding their behavior. Section 403 of the California Penal Code states as follows: "Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor."

VOTING AND DISPOSITION OF ITEMS – Most items require a majority vote of the entire membership of the Board (3 members). When debate on an item is completed, the Board President will instruct the Secretary to "call the roll". Every member present must vote for or against each item; abstentions are not permitted unless there is a Conflict of Interest for which the Board member is obliged to abstain from voting. The Secretary will announce the votes on each item. Any member of the Board may move to "reconsider" any vote on any item on the agenda, except to adjourn, suspend the Rules, or where an intervening event has deprived the Board of jurisdiction, providing that said member originally voted on the prevailing side of the item. The motion to "reconsider" shall only be in order once during the meeting, and once during the next regular meeting. The member requesting reconsideration shall identify for all

members present the Agenda number and subject matter previously voted upon. A motion to reconsider is not debatable and shall require an affirmative vote of three members of the Board.

When the Board has failed by sufficient votes to approve or reject an item, and has not lost jurisdiction over the matter, or has not caused it to be continued beyond the next regular meeting, the issue is again placed on the next agenda for the following meeting for the purpose of allowing the Board to again vote on the matter.

Meeting called to order at 10:12 a.m. Commissioners present were Gross, Finsten, Garcia, Zaft and Wolfson not present. Present from Los Angeles Animal Services (LAAS) Board Secretary Regina Gallegos, Assistant General Manager (AGM) Dana Brown and General Manager (GM) Brenda Barnette; and Assistant City Attorney (ACA) Lori Rittenberg.

Commissioner Gross provided an overview of the meeting agenda, and discussed the appeal process prior to conducting the hearings.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS

1. Dangerous Animal Revocation Case:

Respondent: Michele Lauren Sepe

West Valley Animal Care and Control: Lieutenant Lorna Esparza

Complaining Witness: Lawrence Parks (*taken out of order; heard after item 7.A.*)

Commissioner Gross provided an overview of case DR 162223 WV. Testimony was provided by the Respondent Ms. Sepe who stated that she is taking full responsibility for her dog **Smokey**. She made a mistake not informing her brother of the stipulations imposed on **Smokey**; unfortunately **Smokey** bit Mr. Parks. **Commissioner Gross** noted that there have been several incidents with **Smokey** in which he killed another animal. The Complaining Witness, Mr. Parks, stated being attacked by a pit bull was a horrible experience. The medical bills have not been paid by the Respondent. It is the Board's decision regarding **Smokey**. Mrs. Parks stated it has been an awful experience for her husband and herself. The Respondent did not post signs or put up a fence. Ms. Sepe responded that she will pay the medical bills; a fence has been put up on the property. **Commissioner Garcia** stated it is the responsibility of the Respondent to comply with the terms and conditions.

Commissioner Garcia made a motion to uphold the General Manager's revocation dog license of **Smokey**. **Commissioner Finsten** seconded the motion and it was approved by a vote of 3-0.

2. Dangerous Animal Revocation Case: DR 161249 NC

Respondent: Mark Lederer, David Vigil, Monique Flores, Adriana Molina & Lupe Chavira

North Central Animal Care and Control: Lieutenant John Cessna

Complaining Witness: Vickie Junger *(taken out of order; heard first.)*

Commissioner Gross provided an overview of case DR 161249 NC. Respondents and Complaining Witnesses were not present. The General Manager recommended licenses to be reissued with terms and conditions. There are six dogs involved with several Respondents; however Respondent Mr. Lederer's dog **Biggie** was not involved in the incident. **AGM Brown** stated Mr. Lederer is the only Respondent who appealed. The Hearing Officer recommended that the terms and conditions not apply to Mr. Lederer since **Biggie** was not involved in the incident.

Commissioner Garcia made a motion to grant the appeal of Mr. Lederer.

Commissioner Finsten seconded the motion and it was approved by a vote of 3-0.

- A. Approval of the minutes for the meeting of December 13, 2016. **Commissioner Finsten** made a motion to approve the minutes. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded the motion and it was approved by a vote of 3-0.

4. ORAL REPORT OF THE GENERAL MANAGER *(taken out of order; heard after item 6.B.)*

GM Barnette discussed the following:

- On December 17, 2016, a group of 36 Animal Control Officer candidates assembled at West Valley Animal Shelter for a group informational and

interview session. The session was conducted by Lieutenants Esparza and Botta along with representatives from City Personnel. The department is looking forward to selecting approximately 18 candidates to begin training in February.

- DFO Selder met with volunteers from the Moorpark mobile pet adoption to discuss ways to improve adoptions and better market the pet adoptions for 2017.
- January 9, 2017 we will hold the first Neighborhood Council Animal Liaison Meeting, on from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. The meeting will be held at Ramona Hall: 4580 N. Figueroa St., Los Angeles, CA 90065.
- In another unique public-private partnership, the ASPCA in December and in all of 2016 at our South LA shelter spay/neuter clinic completed 10,465 spay-neuter surgeries of dogs, cats, and rabbits in 2016 provides a considerable, positive impact in our neighborhoods where these services are needed the most.
- On December 14, 2016, Officer Briefman responded to a call for a Dangerous Animal in the 10200 block of Vena Avenue. Officer Briefman arrived on scene, contacted the requestor who stated the dog jumps the fence and chases people acting aggressive and almost bit him today. Officer Briefman observed the dog to reach its entire head through the fence and attempt to bite, and then break through the fence and charge him aggressively. Officer Briefman went into defensive mode and protected himself and fought off the dog, and the dog retreated home, and Officer Briefman was injured as a result has a broken toe and swollen, black and blue foot.
- On December 16, 2016 The Chesterfield Square Animal Shelter received a call for a Dog in Distress in the 7600 Block of Wadsworth Street and the Citizen that called stated a small brown Pit Bull Puppy was in front of her house in the rain. Animal Control Officer H. Aparicio #093 was dispatched the call, once there, he located the puppy and took it out of the rain and transported it back to the Shelter to be seen by a Veterinarian, and placed in the care of Animal Care Technicians. (SLA, A16-030358, CD9)
- On December 12, 2016 Animal Control Officer Riparip was dispatched a call for a bull at large on the 500 block of Avenue 26. The Officer arrived and observed that a film production crew was present, contacted the Security Officer that seemed confused. He claimed that he called his headquarters to request Animal Services about a Pit Bull at large on public streets. Officer Riparip then patrolled the area and the dog was nowhere to be seen, but then later returned and impounded the dog. The film crew was grateful for our Department's quick response (A16-029980, CD 1).
- After a long standing issue with our internet and communication system at our Chesterfield Square South Los Angeles, Time Warner/Spectrum and ITA have finally come together and are working to upgrade the fiber optic lines. The new fiber optic lines will allow for faster internet and system communication throughout the shelter. This upgrade project is expected to be completed by January 20, 2017. Following the Time Warner/Spectrum

installation, City ITA will complete the project.

- Kelsey Onaga, Environmental Health Specialist III with the Los Angeles County Public Health Department stopped by our North Central facility to advise staff that they have two confirmed reported cases of Typhus in the area and believe that they may have contracted it from fleas. The shelter dogs and cats are being treated with frontline and similar products. The wildlife is being sprayed with Adams flea spray. The Officers are actually using frontline on their clothing when coming in contact with wildlife or on investigations that are high risks areas for flea infestations.
- The Department of General Services Project Management held a pre-construction meeting with AGM Dedeaux and the North Central staff regarding the upcoming re-piping project. Construction is set to begin January 17, 2017 and is expected to be completed by May 31, 2017.
- The washing machine at the Harbor location is currently inoperable. Bestway Laundry Solutions came out and made repairs to the unit; however it has been determined that the unit will need to be replaced. A requisition has been issued for the purchase of a new unit in the meantime.
- On December 13, 2016 Animal Control Officers Hatley and Julian responded to a report of an injured coyote in the 23200 block of Ventura Blvd. The coyote appeared to have an injured leg but was still able to run. The Animal Control Officers were able to capture the animal and he was transported to a wildlife rehabilitation rescue for treatment. (WVA, A16-030056, CD3)
- On December 27, 2016 Animal Control Officer Alarcon received a call for an aggressive dog off leash attacking a person on the 1100 block of 18th Street. When Officer Alarcon arrived at the location he found it to be a homeless encampment. Officer Alarcon did not immediately observe the dog, but soon found the animal hiding in a tent with the suspected owner. The animal was safely removed from the tent and impounded pending an Administrative Hearing. The victim received multiple bite wounds to both forearms, was treated by LAFD on site and later hospitalized. (NOC, A16-031187, CD 9)
- The Chesterfield Square South Los Angeles district, The West Valley, The Harbor district and The WLA district each received one newly graduated Animal Control Officer. We congratulate & welcome these officers to the team. They have been scheduled to attend PC 832 training (firearms) in early January 2017.
- On December 23, 2016 The Chesterfield Square Animal Shelter received a call for a Seagull in distress roaming the street with a broken wing. Animal Control Officer Kathleen Dawson responded to the call along the 1800 block of South Clyde Avenue. Officer Dawson conducted a brief search for the Seabird and found it wandering down the street where she managed to corral and capture the bird. The Seagull was taken back to the shelter and attended to by our medical staff. (SLA, A16-031005, CD10)

- On December 20, 2016 the Departments Specialized Mobile Animal Rescue Team (SMART) responded to the 1800 blk of Main St. in Los Angeles. A UPS warehouse reported a sick raccoon stranded 45 feet up in the building's rafters. SMART members set up a technical single rope system (assisted by a 20 foot scissor lift) and entered through a skylight on the rooftop using a rappel style technique to safely rescue the raccoon. (Act. 16-030610, CD 9, closed)
- On December 23, 2016 the West Los Angeles Animal Center received a call for an injured hawk in the backyard of a residence on the 8300 block of Lookout Mountain Avenue. Animal Control Officer Redfield responded to the location and was able to capture an injured hawk. The hawk was returned to the Center and taken to the medical staff. Medical staff called the California Wildlife Center and left a message. The hawk was humanely euthanized after a number of hour due to its injuries and no call back by the rescue organization. (A16-031044, CD5, A1673916)

Phyllis Daugherty: Asked about the vehicles assigned to the 18 new officers and status of the new trucks.

Dan Guss: Mentioned that the General Manager's Oral report has no important issues. He will discuss what isn't reported on City Watch & KFI AM-60 radio.

6. Board Reports

- A. Staff Report requesting approval to make amendments to the Animal Auction Policy. (Action Item; Public comment limited to two minutes per speaker).

AGM Brown explained the Department's recommendation on propose changes to the current Animal Auction Policy. Mentioned fairness related to the participants interested in adopting the same pet; further extend restriction to other animal rescue groups from the auction process; restricting participants to one winning bid per calendar year.

Commissioner Gross mentioned concern that in an auction a family should be the first priority over a rescue group. **AGM Brown** mentioned that the rescue groups were bidding against families; however there were not a large number of rescue groups participating in the auction. **Commissioner Garcia** asked about policy for groups and individuals participating in the auction. **AGM Brown** responded that there are two parts to the policy 1. Restricting rescue groups from participating in the auction process. 2. Restricting individuals to one winning bid per calendar year. **Commissioner Finsten** asked about the auction process. **AGM Brown** responded that the auction process is used when more than one person wants to adopt the animal this happens frequently.

Commissioner Garcia made a motion to approve amendments to the Animal Auction Policy. **Commissioner Finsten** seconded the motion and it was approved by a vote of 3-0.

Public Comment:

Phyllis Daugherty: Supports the Department's recommendation. Overall the auction process is wonderful for the animals; not using public funds or special favors; great revenue for the Department; concerned with bonded dogs in auction process.

- B. Staff Report requesting approval of a policy for displaying literature at our six City Animal Shelters. (Action Item; Public comment limited to two minutes per speaker).

AGM Brown explained that the Department receives multiple requests to promote products online and in our shelters. These solicitations frequently involve the display of literature in the public areas of shelters. The Department does not have staff hours to review and approve materials before they are they are printed to insure that they do not contain inaccurate information. It is recommended to the Board to approve the policy to limit literature/information displayed in LA City Shelters to be materials that meet one or more of the following criteria: displayed in LA City Shelters to materials that meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Materials that are produced by the City of Los Angeles or other State/Federal government entity;
- Materials that are produced by a contracted partner of the City of Los Angeles;
- Materials that advertise a sponsored benefit to Los Angeles Animal Services.

Commissioner Gross stated he agrees overall however his concern is whether this is restricting information to the public; understands staff cannot approve materials. **Commissioner Garcia** asked what has been displayed in the shelters. **AGM Brown** responded advertisements from the community and news publications which present more of an issue. **Commissioner Finsten** asked if there have been complaints from the public. **AGM Brown** responded there are no complaints from the public however materials were removed due to inappropriate contents. **Commissioner Gross** stated to include additions to the policy; move forward with recommendation. **Commissioner Garcia** concerned about the last bullet point.

Commissioner Finsten made a motion to approve the policy on literature displayed in City shelters and requested staff to report with expansive bullet points. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded the motion and it was approved by a vote of 3-0.

Public Comment:

Phyllis Daugherty: Mentioned that there is government policy regarding publications; if it is not a government brochure it shouldn't be displayed; there is a liability; there are scams. The General Manager should approve what is displayed in City shelters.

Dan Guss: Talked about Pet Press Publication .The General Manager did not allow Pet Press Publication displayed in City shelters. Independent articles are heard in the mainstream media therefore should be heard in City shelters.

7. DISCUSSION ITEMS

- A. Proposal to Give Adopters the Opportunity to List a 'Pet Guardian' in Adoption Application in Case Owner Dies or Is Incapacitated. (Public comment limited to one minute per speaker).

Commissioner Gross tabled item due to Commissioner Wolfson's absence.

Phyllis Daugherty: Mentioned there is no legal guardian of animals; needs to be clear and stated in legal terms.

Commissioner Gross made a motion to adjourn the meeting. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded the motion and it was approved by a vote of 3 - 0.
