<u>AGENDAS</u> - The Board of Animal Services Commissioners (Board) meets regularly every second (2nd) and fourth (4th) Tuesday of each month at 10:00 A.M. Regular Meetings are held at City Hall, 200 North Spring Street, Room 1060, in Los Angeles, CA 90012. Evening Meetings are held in various locations throughout the City, from 7:00 to approximately 9:30 P.M. The agendas for Board meetings contain a brief general description of those items to be considered at the meetings. Board Agendas are available at the Department of Animal Services (Department), Administrative Division, 221 North Figueroa Street, 6th Floor, Suite 600, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Board Agendas may also be viewed on the 2nd floor Public Bulletin Board in City Hall East, 200 North Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Internet users may also access copies of present and prior agenda items, copies of the Board Calendar, MP-3 audio files of meetings as well as electronic copies of approved minutes on the Department's World Wide Web Home Page site at http://www.laanimalservices.com/CommissionAgendas.htm

Three (3) members of the Board constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Some items on the Agenda may be approved without any discussion.

The Board Secretary will announce the items to be considered by the Board. The Board will hear the presentation on the topic and gather additional information from Department Staff. Once presentations have finished, the Board President will ask if any Board Member or member of the public wishes to speak on one or more of these items. Each speaker called before the Commission will have one (1) minute to express their comments and concerns on matters placed on the agenda. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes.)

<u>PUBLIC INPUT AT BOARD MEETINGS</u> – Public Participation on Agenda Items. Members of the public will have an opportunity to address the Board on agenda items after the item is called and before the Board takes action on the item, unless the opportunity for public participation on the item was previously provided to all interested members of the public at a public meeting of a Committee of the Board and the item has not substantially changed since the Committee heard the item. When speaking to an agenda item other than during Public Comment (see Public Comment below), the speaker shall limit his or her comments to the specific item under consideration (California Government Code, Section 54954.3).

Public Comment. The Board will provide an opportunity for public comment at every regular meeting of the Board. Members of the public may address the Board on any items within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board as part of Public Comment.

Speaker Cards. Members of the public wishing to speak are to fill out one speaker card for each agenda item on which they wish to speak and present it to the Board secretary **before** the item is called.

Time Limit for Speakers. Speakers addressing the Board will be limited to one (1) minute of speaking time for each agenda item except during general public comment period which is limited to two (2) minutes per speaker. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes each.). The Chairperson, with the approval of a majority of the Board, may for good cause extend any speaker's time by increments of up to one (1) minute.

Brown Act. These rules shall be interpreted in a manner that is consistent with the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section § 54950 et seq.

<u>STANDARDS OF CONDUCT.</u> Speakers are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from personal attacks or use of profanity or language that may incite violence.

All persons present at Board meetings are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from disrupting the

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meeting, interfering with the rights of others to address the Board and/or interfering with the conduct of business by the Board.

In the event that any speaker does not comply with the foregoing requirements, or if a speaker does not address the specific item under consideration, the speaker may be ruled out of order, their speaking time forfeited and the Chairperson may call upon the next speaker.

The Board, by majority vote, may order the removal from the meeting of any speaker or audience member continuing to behave in a disruptive manner after being warned by the Chairperson regarding their behavior. Section 403 of the California Penal Code states as follows: "Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor."

<u>VOTING AND DISPOSITION OF ITEMS</u> – Most items require a majority vote of the entire membership of the Board (3 members). When debate on an item is completed, the Board President will instruct the Secretary to "call the roll". Every member present must vote for or against each item; abstentions are not permitted unless there is a Conflict of Interest for which the Board member is obliged to abstain from voting. The Secretary will announce the votes on each item. Any member of the Board may move to "reconsider" any vote on any item on the agenda, except to adjourn, suspend the Rules, or where an intervening event has deprived the Board of jurisdiction, providing that said member originally voted on the prevailing side of the item. The motion to "reconsider" shall only be in order once during the meeting, and once during the next regular meeting. The member requesting reconsideration shall identify for all members present the Agenda number and subject matter previously voted upon. A motion to reconsider is not debatable and shall require an affirmative vote of three members of the Board.

When the Board has failed by sufficient votes to approve or reject an item, and has not lost jurisdiction over the matter, or has not caused it to be continued beyond the next regular meeting, the issue is again placed on the next agenda for the following meeting for the purpose of allowing the Board to again vote on the matter.

Meeting called to order at 10:13 a.m. Commissioners present were Zaft, Gross, Garcia, Wolfson arrived late. Commissioner Finsten was absent. Also present from Los Angeles Animal Services (LAAS) Board Secretary Regina Gallegos, General Manager (GM) Brenda Barnette, Assistant General Manager (AGM), Dana Brown and Assistant City Attorney (ACA) Dov Lesel.

Commissioner Zaft opened the meeting and provided an overview of the meeting agenda.

Commissioner Gross discussed the appeal hearing process and conducted the hearings.

I. ADMINISTATIVE APPEALS

1. Barking Dog Revocation Noise Case: BR 161256 EV(Decision continued from 2/14/17) Respondent: Glenn Morren

East Valley Animal Care and Control: Captain Karen Knipscheer-Cox Complaining Witness: Bruce Gale

The Respondent Glenn Morren along with his attorney Michael Rosten appeared before the Commission. Mr. Rosten asked the Board to set aside the order of revocation. There is lack of evidence to show that there were any violations of any terms and conditions made, that were substantial enough to justify a revocation of the dog licenses. The Witness Bruce Gale was unable to attend the hearing and provided a written statement. **Commissioner Gross** stated his concern with the response received from the Hearing Officer more information was needed on Terms and Conditions. **Commissioner Wolfson** asked how many dogs at Respondents residence. **Commissioner Zaft** responded the Complaining Witness stated four dogs in his testimony. **Commissioner Wolfson** asked if there was only one witness. **Commissioner Zaft** stated one complaint is valid; more witness would help in decision. **Commissioner Garcia** stated the reasoning is not clear therefore revocation should be dismissed. **Commissioner Wolfson** made a motion to overturn the General Manager's decision and to reinstate license to original terms and conditions with addition of bark collars. Change original Term # 1 that identifies "Big Hoss", "Scruffy" and "Shasta" at residence. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded the vote was 2-2; the motion failed.

2. Dangerous Animal Case: DA 161246 BH

Respondent: Ezra and Cynthia Ozer West Los Angeles Animal Care and Control: Captain Wendell Bowers Complaining Witness: Zohreh Kangavary

The Respondents along with their attorney Michael Rosten appeared before the Commission. Mr. Rosten stated the Department did not consider the Respondents unwillingness and inability to comply with Terms and Conditions. "Elvis" is not an aggressive dog. The injury to the witness was not caused by a bite or an aggressive approach. The Complaining Witness Zohren Kangavary and daughter Hasti Merabi were in attendance. Ms. Merabi spoke on behalf of her mother. Ms. Merabi explained her mother's injuries and emphasized that "Elvis" is an aggressive dog and he was off his leash. Mr. Rosten reinstated that "Elvis" is not an aggressive dog; he is playful. **Commissioner Zaft** read procedures from LMAC 53.34.4.

Commissioner Wolfson made a motion to uphold the General Manager's decision. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded the motion and it was approved by a vote of 4-0.

3. Dangerous Animal Case: DA 172068 BH

Respondent: Ezra and Cynthia Ozer West Los Angeles Animal Care and Control: Captain Wendell Bowers Complaining Witness: Hasti Merabi

The Respondents along with their attorney Michael Rosten appeared before the Commission. Mr. Rosten stated that his clients dog "Elvis" did not bite, cause injury, or approach the Complainant in an aggressive manner. "Elvis" was trying to play with the Complainant's dog. The Complainant did not submit any veterinary or medical report depicting any injury to a person or animal. The Hearing Officer wrongfully considered the incident in the original case as prior conduct that justified recommending revocation of "Elvis" dog license. The Complaining Witness Ms. Merabi talked about the video of the the attack on her seven year old daughter and dog. **Commissioner Zaft** asked about the attack. Ms. Merabi responded that "Elvis" jumped on her daughter for a few minutes. Mr. Rosten reinstated that the Respondents dog expert stated "Elvis" was just playing. **Commissioner Zaft** noted that the Hearing Officer's report was in great detail. The Hearing Officer's conclusion stated the owners were unable to maintain and manage the dog safely. The Respondent stated that it was her son who let "Elvis" out of the property;

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willing to pay for medical costs. **Commissioner Garcia asked** if the Department imposed terms and conditions; this is a difficult case. **Commissioner Gross** concerned Respondents can maintain the dog and insure safety of community. **Commissioner Wolfson** retracted his motion due to additional discussion.

Commissioner Zaft made a motion to reverse the General Manager's decision and direct the Department to impose terms and conditions related to proper confinement to "Elvis". **Commissioner Garcia** seconded and it was approved by vote of 4-0.

4. Dangerous Animal Case: DA 161322 WLA

Respondent: Joana Cruz West Los Angeles Animal Care and Control: Captain Wendell Bowers Complaining Witness: Olga Jerinic and Paul Koenig

The Respondent along with her attorney Marla Tauscher appeared before the Commission. Ms. Tauscher stated that her client complied with all necessary changes requested by the Department. There have been no complaints of any incidents involving "Zero". There is no evidence of "Zero" attacking dogs; "Zero" has been home with Respondent since incident. The Complaining Witnesses Olga Jerinic and Paul Koenig were not in attendance. Commissioner Zaft mentioned Complaining Witness stated that there were three incidents from September 2012 - July 2015 in which "Zero" escaped from property multiple times. Commissioner Gross mentioned "Zero" was off leash; incidents occurred involving "Zero" was significant however no incidents have occurred since "Zero" has been home. Commissioner Wolfson mentioned the Respondents have shown dog ownership and responsibility by providing a letter and photos. Commissioner Zaft concerned with lack of Hearing Officer's specific findings necessary to be made to specific evidence. Commissioner Garcia concurred with Commissioner Zaft. Commissioner Wolfson expressed gratitude toward Commissioner Zaft and Commissioner Gross for reviewing and taking appeals seriously; there are many tough situations.

Commissioner Zaft made a motion to reverse the General Manager's decision to reinstate dog owner license and directed the Department to impose Terms and Conditions. **Commissioner Wolfson** seconded the motion it was approved of a vote 4-0.

II. REGULAR COMMISSION MEETING

1. PUBLIC COMMENT

Phyllis Daugherty: Talked about Capacity for Care Case Studies

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spay/neuter pilot program; there is no study of any kind for cats spay/neuter 1.5 lbs/6weeks; asked the Department what they based their findings on; this is an experiment; there is criteria.

Manual Murillo: Talked about his impounded dog "Vader"; made complaints about his dog being mistreated in the shelter; this is his emotional support dog; wants to re-adopt his dog.

Mandi Mashi: Attended the meeting in support of her friend Manuel Murillo. Ms. Mashi stated that Mr. Murrillo's charges were dismissed at without penalty at the hearing; however AGM Dedeaux stated that "Vader" is for rescue only prior to the results of the hearing. Mr. Murillo has pictures of his dog's tail cut off; dog was starving; conditions were horrendous; Mr. Murillo wants his dog back.

Commissioner Gross made a motion to approve the minutes. **Commissioner Wolfson** seconded the motion and it was approved by a vote of 4-0.

4. ORAL REPORT OF THE GENERAL MANAGER

GM Barnette discussed the following:

- Congratulations to Mayor Garcetti on his re-election. City Council member incumbents have all been re-elected.
- Director of Field Operations, Jan Felder will be out on an extended leave of absence for personal reasons. Jan is responsible for coordination of special events, issuing of filming permits, and handling media calls. Her assignments will be redistributed.

- Dr. Prupas meet with Dr. Mackie and showed one of our facilities.
- Spoke with three veterinarians: Kathy Tyson spay/neuter cats at 1.3 lbs/3 to 4 years, Cindi Delaney spay/neuter cats at 1.5 lbs/5 years, Gary Weitzman stated no problem to spay/neuter at 1.5 lbs/6 weeks.
- On February 28, 2017, LA Animal Services celebrated World Spay Day at Superior Grocers on Avalon Blvd. and 102nd St., in Watts with KTLA's Gayle Anderson and The Lucy Pet Foundation. Dogs and cats from the community were spayed or neutered and pets from North Central and South LA shelter were available for adoption. During the event, Councilmember Buscaino surprised Gayle Anderson by proclaiming the day "Gayle Anderson Day" in the City of Los Angeles and recognized her during City Council for her contribution to raise awareness of pet adoption and spaying/neutering companion animals.
- On March 1st, a Possible Dangerous Animal Hearing was held for two pitbulls allegedly involved in a mauling in Lincoln Heights on February 2nd. The hearing drew quite a bit of media attention as the victim died on Monday morning as a result of the injuries he sustained during the attack. Several media outlets came to the public hearing to observe as members of the public. The hearing officer admonished that no filming or recording would be allowed during the hearing. The hearing was conducted and the media did attempt to interview both the victim's family as well as the dog owners. No interviews were allowed in the Animal Services suite.
- March 23, 2017 For the third year in a row, ABC 7 along with Helpful Honda will be hosting Puppy Palooza during the morning news. Puppies from all six City Shelters will be featured on-air and then ABC 7 will come to the North Central Shelter at noon to interview and capture the puppies getting adopted. This is a great event for the shelters and helps spread the word about the wonderful pets of all ages and breeds available for adoption.

Public Comment:

Phyllis Daugherty: Mentioned that a few letters from veterinarians don't constitute tested procedure; City shelters are not the same condition as private vets. The Department is a Municipal shelter and responsible for animals.

6. Board Reports

A. Staff Request for Approval of Use of Animal Welfare Trust Fund to Purchase Shelter Safety Equipment. (heard after item 6.C)

AGM Dedeaux gave a description and cost of safety equipment items for purchase. **Commissioner Gross** asked whether the safety equipment is for all shelters. **AGM Dedeaux** responded it is for all shelters with the exception of the kennel lighting (North Central Shelter) and the tripods (SMART). **Commissioner Wolfson** asked how many radios for purchase. AGM Dedeaux responded 100 radios with 6 extra channels; mentioned in need of new tripod for (SMART); new signage at entrances and hallways.

Commissioner Gross made a motion to approve the use of Animal Welfare Trust Funds for Shelter Safety Equipment. **Commissioner Wolfson** seconded and it was approve by a vote of 4-0.

Public Comment:

Phyllis Daugherty: This is what management is about; the department needs to concentrate on the shelters; Animal Control Officers are in older vehicles.

B. Staff Report of Inventory of Dogs Currently Impounded as Evidence Animals. (Heard before item 6.A)

AGM Brown provided an overview on the inventory of dogs currently impounded as evidence. The report is broken down in 3 categories. 1. Possible Dangerous Animals. 2. Humane Investigations. 3. Police Holds. These animals continue to be on hold and are not on the list. **Commissioner Zaft** asked about the holds on animals dated August 2016. **AGM Brown** responded the Department will need to pull files to identify the case; hearings are set 7 days after impound. The part time scheduler for appeals is not permitted to be gone from work for more than 7 days; hearing 4 cases a day; postpone hearings are handled on a case

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to case basis. AGM Brown asked the Commission for guidelines on when to allow a rescheduled on appeals. Commissioner Garcia asked if revocation is subject to rescue only outside of Los Angeles. AGM Brown responded each animal is looked at individually. AGM Brown talked about the Humane Investigations; some animals become available before the investigation and made available to the public. Commissioner Gross asked the Department for quarterly report of Inventory of Dogs Impounded as Evidence Animals. AGM Brown explained Police Holds are when the police ask the Department to kennel animals for a brief timeframe. Commissioner Zaft asked about the policy in treatments of animals in all categories. AGM Dededaux responded most dogs are walked; all dogs get attention; depends on degree of the animals' temperament. **Commissioner Wolfson** mentioned the change in policy that volunteers can take evidence animals out. AGM Dededaux responded volunteers have an opportunity to walk evidence animals; volunteers know there limitations, Commissioner Zaft asked if staff and volunteers walk the animals. AGM Dedeaux responded its combined effort.

Public Comment: None

C. Staff Report on Pending Hearings. (heard after item 6.B)

AGM Brown stated that the Department is very pleased to report there is no backlog on impound and barking dog hearings. As of February 17, 2017 there are 449 non-impound cases waiting to be heard. **Commissioner Gross** asked about the type of non-impound cases. **AGM Brown** stated they are all Potential Dangerous Animals Cases. **GM Barette** mentioned when she arrived at the Department there was only one hearing officer. **AGM Brown** stated the Department won't catch up on the hearings. The Department is proposing to contract out for administrative hearings services. **Commissioner Zaft** suggested the Commission to assist on the issue; it's a serious problem. **GM Barnette** agreed with Commissioner Zaft. The Department can provide recommendations to the Commission; provide a proposal to the Board and include it in the budget. **Commissioner Zaft** thanked the Department for prioritizing and addressing impound and barking dog cases.

Public Comment:

Phyllis Daugherty: Shared a story on a case of a non-impounded animal; the word confinement needs to be addressed.

APPROVE Los Angeles Animal Services' (LAAS) developing and releasing an RFP seeking Free 30 day Pet Insurance for Adopters.

BACKGROUND:

Pets in shelters can be inadvertently exposed to illness. These conditions may be more of a nuisance that any real threat but they may also be an added expense for the individual or family who has just adopted a new family member and likely purchased a bed, feeding bowls, collar and a leash. Shelters around the country are taking advantage of pet insurance that several companies are offering for free for the first 30 days after adoption.

At first, pet insurance was either extremely expensive to obtain or it was given out to adopters for 30 days if the shelter was using certain software for data management. That is no longer the case. There are 10 insurance companies given high ratings by a group called Consumer Advocate: <u>https://www.consumersadvocate.org/pet-insurance/compare</u>.

Consumer Advocate gives specific guidelines for comparing pet insurance and suggests what the pet insurance plan should cover and what it should not cover. These guidelines are easy to use and will be excellent tools to evaluate proposals received in response to a RFP.

We will seek a company with an excellent rating that will offer LAAS adopters Free 30 day pet insurance for pets adopted from our City animal shelters.

We will seek to negotiate an arrangement that allows the adopter to sign up for the insurance within 24-48 hours of the adoption and advise the adopter that the insurance company will invite

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and encourage them to continue the coverage after the free 30-day coverage expires. This will allow the adopter to make the choice and will prevent LAAS from providing client information.

SUMMARY:

We believe that this is a service that will give LAAS a competitive edge and will encourage adopters to adopt from a City shelter.

SUBJECT: DEVELOP LAAS ADOPTION APP & PET PORTAL

BOARD ACTIONS RECOMMENDED:

APPROVE Los Angeles Animal Services' (LAAS) staff to work with the City Attorney to develop an MOU between Pet Lifestyle Group (PLG) and LAAS on a partnership/joint new-to-market cobranded Pet Adoption matchmaking app and Pet Lifestyle Portal.

BACKGROUND:

As a City municipal shelter that serves our taxpayers, we have struggled with how to best provide non-judgmental adoption counseling and support to our adopters. To adopt, the person must be over eighteen years of age and have a State of California ID or driver's license from DMV.

We believe that if we create a fun and safe opportunity for individuals or families to select a companion animal that best fits their interests and lifestyle, we will facilitate a better bonding opportunity with that pet.

We also would like to provide ongoing support and information to our adopters that we are not currently able to provide. We believe this will lead to better pet care and a better life for the family and the pet.

I met Kristen Stavola through her work with stray dogs, wildlife and her Neighborhood Council. Kristen asked how she can help us. We started talking about a type of "match.com" for shelter pets that could be accessed in the shelter lobbies, on the Internet, and a downloadable mobile app. The idea is for the prospective adopter to enter a profile of him or herself (or the family) that would be used to generate a list of possible compatible pets that the adopter may want to meet at the shelter. I also asked that the program be multilingual to serve the diverse population of Los Angeles.

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At our next meeting Kristen came with a plan. She re-worked an existing adoption app model she had been developing for rescue organization and tailored it to LAAS' needs:

- PLG, a technology, marketing and entertainment industry veteran dedicated to supporting the No Kill Movement and overall pet enrichment through educational and informational programming, propose a partnership/joint venture with LAAS on a new-to-market co-branded Pet Adoption matchmaking app and Pet Lifestyle Portal.
- PLG will develop and build an adoption app and pet portal with a specific focus on better matching the City's homeless pet population with potential adopters.
- Once successfully adopted, the pet owner can opt into a pet portal that will provide them with educational and informational live and on-demand programming aimed at every stage of a pet's life. LAAS will be able to use the portal to track licensing, lost pets, vaccinations, offer responsible pet owner certification courses and raise donations for City Shelter programs.

A community of well-matched, educated and well-informed pet owners is a key to achieving and maintaining No-Kill status in Los Angeles. A population of happy, healthy, well-trained, spayed and neutered pets is part and parcel to reducing the City's homeless shelter pet population.

Nothing like this experience presently exists. In exchange for the development and build out and co-branding opportunity, LAAS will provide an invaluable pet Q&A section, access to shelter guest waiting for new homes of their own and will give adopters endless resources from informational articles to videos such as those filmed by Robert Cabral.

BOARD ACTIONS RECOMMENDED:

• RECEIVE AND FILE this report.

SUMMARY:

The Department of Animal Services has been working on recruiting and hiring Animal Control Officers for well over a year. The City allocated a total of 24 new Animal Control Officer positions over two budget cycles. These positions are necessary for adequate field deployment and appropriate response times to critical calls for service.

The current Department Personnel Ordinance (FY17) authorizes 54 ACO I's and 29 ACO II's for a total of 83 ACO's. Of those 25 are currently vacant (as of 3-18-17). There are 18-22 candidates that are still in some phase of the background process. If cleared they will be scheduled for medical and psychological exams.

BACKGROUND:

The exam for Animal Control officer opened in July 2015. It was opened as a continuous exam meaning the exam would be given multiple times until a sufficient number of eligibles were on the list. The first test date was in August of 2015. At that time 51 applicants were invited to take the exam. Only 38 of them showed up. Of those only 23 moved on past the physical abilities test. The Personnel Department had another test administration scheduled for October of that year where another 55 applicants were invited. It became clear to Animal Services that the examination schedule was insufficient for our needs and a meeting was arranged with the Examining Division of the Personnel Department. During the meeting we explained our concerns and the Examining Division managers were open to assist. In response they

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scheduled a number of additional test dates inviting well over 330 candidates. At the end of the testing cycle over 100 candidates had passed all elements of the written and physical exams and were eligible for interview.

After certifying the list, interviewing candidates and making selections, those selected moved on to the Backgrounds portion of the process which is where the real challenge was met. In short, the Personnel Department did not have an active contract for field investigations. As such, they were limited to available City staff to complete the field investigations. Likewise, once the field investigation was completed, it was determined that many of the candidates did not meet the threshold for maturity, integrity, or judgment required for this position. Unfortunately as those candidates were non-selected, they remained on the eligibility list preventing the Department from moving past them and hiring candidates with lower scores. Overall the Department was only able to hire 10 Animal Control Officers from this effort. Five of them have completed training and have been deployed at animal shelters. Two of them terminated employment and three remain in the training program.

Animal Services is working in cooperation with the Personnel Department to make necessary changes to the process. Those changes must be discussed with the affected labor organization but we believe that these changes will make for a more seamless and efficient hiring process to the benefit of both the City as well as the candidates. Until those changes are made, however, we are continuing to work with the process as it currently exists.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal impact of short staffing is difficult to quantify. Issues ranging from overtime to worker's compensation injuries all play a role in insufficient staffing levels. The Department will continue to work with the City to identify avenues to increase staffing to a level consistent with the needs of the community.
