AGENDAS - The Board of Animal Services Commissioners (Board) meets regularly every second (2nd) and fourth (4th) Tuesday of each month at 9:00 A.M. Regular Meetings are held at City Hall, 200 North Spring Street, Room 1060, in Los Angeles, CA 90012. Evening Meetings are held in various locations throughout the City, from 7:00 to approximately 9:30 P.M. The agendas for Board meetings contain a brief general description of those items to be considered at the meetings. Board Agendas are available at the Department of Animal Services (Department), Administrative Division, 221 North Figueroa Street, 6th Floor, Suite 600, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Board Agendas may also be viewed on the 2nd floor Public Bulletin Board in City Hall East, 200 North Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Internet users may also access copies of present and prior agenda items, copies of the Board Calendar, MP-3 audio files of meetings as well as electronic copies of approved minutes on the Department's World Wide Web Home Page site at http://www.laanimalservices.com/CommissionAgendas.htm

Three (3) members of the Board constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Some items on the Agenda

may be approved without any discussion.

The Board Secretary will announce the items to be considered by the Board. The Board will hear the presentation on the topic and gather additional information from Department Staff. Once presentations have finished, the Board President will ask if any Board Member or member of the public wishes to speak on one or more of these items. Each speaker called before the Commission will have one (1) minute to express their comments and concerns on matters placed on the agenda. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes.)

<u>PUBLIC INPUT AT BOARD MEETINGS</u> – Public Participation on Agenda Items. Members of the public will have an opportunity to address the Board on agenda items after the item is called and before the Board takes action on the item, unless the opportunity for public participation on the item was previously provided to all interested members of the public at a public meeting of a Committee of the Board and the item has not substantially changed since the Committee heard the item. When speaking to an agenda item other than during Public Comment (see Public Comment below), the speaker shall limit his or her comments to the specific item under consideration (California Government Code, Section 54954.3).

Public Comment. The Board will provide an opportunity for public comment at every regular meeting of the Board. Members of the public may address the Board on any items within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board as part of Public Comment.

Speaker Cards. Members of the public wishing to speak are to fill out one speaker card for each agenda item on which they wish to speak and present it to the Board secretary **before** the item is called.

Time Limit for Speakers. Speakers addressing the Board will be limited to one (1) minute of speaking time for each agenda item except during general public comment period which is limited to two (2) minutes per speaker. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes each.). The Chairperson, with the approval of a majority of the Board, may for good cause extend any speaker's time by increments of up to one (1) minute.

Brown Act. These rules shall be interpreted in a manner that is consistent with the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section § 54950 et seq.

<u>STANDARDS OF CONDUCT.</u> Speakers are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from personal attacks or use of profanity or language that may incite violence.

All persons present at Board meetings are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from disrupting the meeting, interfering with the rights of others to address the Board and/or interfering with the conduct of business by the Board.

In the event that any speaker does not comply with the foregoing requirements, or if a speaker does not address the specific item under consideration, the speaker may be ruled out of order, their speaking time forfeited and the Chairperson may call upon the next speaker.

The Board, by majority vote, may order the removal from the meeting of any speaker or audience member continuing to behave in a disruptive manner after being warned by the Chairperson regarding their behavior. Section 403 of the California Penal Code states as follows: "Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is quilty of a misdemeanor."

<u>VOTING AND DISPOSITION OF ITEMS</u> – Most items require a majority vote of the entire membership of the Board (3 members). When debate on an item is completed, the Board President will instruct the Secretary to "call the roll". Every member present must vote for or against each item; abstentions are not permitted unless there is a Conflict of Interest for which the Board member is obliged to abstain from voting. The Secretary will announce the votes on each

item. Any member of the Board may move to "reconsider" any vote on any item on the agenda, except to adjourn, suspend the Rules, or where an intervening event has deprived the Board of jurisdiction, providing that said member originally voted on the prevailing side of the item. The motion to "reconsider" shall only be in order once during the meeting, and once during the next regular meeting. The member requesting reconsideration shall identify for all members present the Agenda number and subject matter previously voted upon. A motion to reconsider is not debatable and shall require an affirmative vote of three members of the Board.

When the Board has failed by sufficient votes to approve or reject an item, and has not lost jurisdiction over the matter, or has not caused it to be continued beyond the next regular meeting, the issue is again placed on the next agenda for the following meeting for the purpose of allowing the Board to again vote on the matter.

Meeting called to order at 7:09 p.m. Commissioners present were Gross, García, Dicker, Finsten and Wolfson (Commissioners Garcia and Finsten were not present at the time attendance was taken but arrived at 7:12 p.m. and 7:17 p.m., respectively). Also present from Los Angeles Animal Services (LAAS) Board Secretary Johana Moran, General Manager (GM) Brenda Barnette; and Assistant City Attorney (ACA) Dov Lesel.

Commissioner Gross opened the meeting, introduced staff and provided an overview of the meeting agenda.

I. REGULAR COMMISSION MEETING

1. PUBLIC COMMENT

Marla Tauscher: Asked to know the specific law that prohibits her from using the public comment period to comment on an agenda item. ACA Lesel stated that he is prohibited from responding and will send Ms. Tauscher the information via email. Ms. Tauscher also commented on emergency plans, killing animals for space, and the Board's priorities. Diana Mendoza: Identified herself as a member of PETA and spoke on an incident of a dog at large in the Echo Park area and lack of response from the North Central Animal Shelter. Ms. Mendoza urged the Board to press for the report on call response times. Andrew Brown: Commented on the need for better customer service and providing accurate information to adopters. Mr. Brown reported issue with "first rights" not being noted on kennel cards. Gail Raff: Commented on the need for education for underage kitten fosters. Whitney Smith: Commended LAAS New Hope Coordinator Tiffani Hamilton for her tireless efforts on behalf of kittens. Ms. Smith commented on the need for instant microchip scanning in cases of owner surrender. Josh Liddy: Commented that he still has educational banners available for the shelters. Mr. Liddy stated that the Board is ignoring relevant issues in favor of the dog food issue.

2. NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL COMMENTS - (Discussion with Neighborhood Council representatives on Neighborhood Council Resolutions or Community Impact Statements filed with the City Clerk which relate to any agenda item listed or being considered on this agenda for the Board of Animal Services Commissioners)

Public Comment: None

3. COMMISSION BUSINESS

A. Approval of the Minutes for Meeting of November 28, 2017.

Commissioner Wolfson made a motion to approve the minutes of November 28, 2017. **Commissioner Garcia** seconded and the motion was approved by a unanimous vote of 5-0.

Public Comment:

None.

4. ORAL REPORT OF THE GENERAL MANAGER

GM Barnette discussed the following:

- An email went viral about a dog named Bradley and allegations that LAAS
 Officers did not check on the dog when in fact they did. The Department
 issued citations and matched the dog owners up with an intervention group to
 help them obtain dog houses, blankets and training on proper animal care.
 Unfortunately, viral posts caused public alarm and the dog was stolen.
- In response to the fires, evacuation centers were set up at Hansen Dam, the Los Angeles Equestrian Center and in Arleta. A Mighty Mover trailer for small animals was stationed beside residents evacuated from their homes. No shelter animals were killed to make space for incoming animals.
- Commended volunteer Andrew Brown for his work in chicken rescue.

Public Comment:

Whitney Smith: Commented on the incident involving Bradley the dog and on her experience communicating with Animal Control Officers.

Andrew Brown: Commented on community response to the fires, including donations, fosters, adopters and volunteers.

5. COMMISSIONERS' ORAL REPORTS AND FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Commissioner Wolfson: Passed.

Commissioner Dicker: Thanked Andrew Brown for assisting him in adopting a dog from East Valley two years ago today and spoke about his dog's behavioral transformation after leaving the shelter. Commissioner Dicker spoke about the importance of foster based sheltering as the future of no-kill; requested report from the LAAS volunteer coordinator; mentioned the need to review the quality of food fed to shelter cats; called for metrics and statistics on number of times dogs get out of kennels; lamented the slow progress of the Cat Program EIR and injunction.

Commissioner Garcia: Mentioned Gail Raff's public comment and suggested setting money aside to have a company create handouts for fosters on humane education to be easily accessible on the LAAS website and in the shelters. Commissioner Garcia spoke on the need for expanding the intervention program to

all of the shelters.

Commissioner Gross: Mentioned that a report from the Volunteer Coordinator is expected in January. **GM Barnette** added that the Volunteer Coordinator has been out on leave to care for a critically ill parent. **Commissioner Gross** commended LAAS staff and volunteers for response to the fires; spoke on intervention groups; announced upcoming workshops held by LAAS, LA Housing and Community Investment Department and the Housing Rights Center on the topic of Pets in Housing for tenants and landlords.

Commissioner Finsten: Passed.

Public Comment:

Jay Weiner: Spoke on his experience providing emergency aid during fire; there was good coordination for small animals but witnessed many large animals suffer. Mr. Weiner stated that there was chaos when it came to coordination of resources for horse and large animal evacuations. He handed out brochures of the Gentle Barn Foundation. Commissioner Wolfson stated that Jay Weiner is one of the founders of Gentle Barn; stated that they have a sophisticated rescue operation for large animals; commended their efforts for going above and beyond to save the lives of animals.

Gail Raff: Stated that handouts are not good enough; the shelters give kittens to anyone and they are in harm's way. Ms. Raff urged for education and contracts for fosters.

6. BOARD REPORTS

A. Recommendation to Report Back With a Feasibility Analysis Presenting the Benefits and Risks of Providing an Association of American Feed Control Officials (AAFCO) Approved, Plant-Based Diet for Shelter Dogs.

Commissioner Gross announced that the recommendation before the Board tonight is whether or not the Department should conduct a feasibility study and a cost-benefit analysis on providing plant-based diets for shelter dogs. He stated that tonight is not going to be a debate on the pros and cons of feeding plant-based diets to shelter dogs. Commissioner Gross stated that the purpose of the study is to get all the facts and information in a systematic way that is transparent. He mentioned that due to time constraints and the number of speaker cards received, speakers must limit their comments to one minute.

Commissioner Wolfson stated that he is a member of the environmental rights community, animal rights community and the companion animal rescue community. He applauded the work done for companion animals by LAAS staff and GM Barnette; applauded the work done for farm animals and wild animals by various groups within the animal rights community; applauded the work done for environmental awareness and protection by environmental groups. Commissioner Wolfson spoke about his experience serving on this Board and reasons for making his proposal to recommend feeding plant-based food to shelter dogs that lead up to the discussion held at the previous meeting. He

mentioned that due to a clerical error made on the agenda, the proposal was not made an action item; he summarized the outcome of the previous meeting. Commissioner Wolfson spoke about his experience attending a vigil with activists providing drinking water to piglets headed for slaughter and how affected the was by the experience. He spoke about the number of animals killed to produce Canidae Life Stages dog food fed to shelter dogs, including that the number is much higher than he previously estimated; spoke about the harmful effects of feeding the dogs meat-based food. Commissioner Wolfson commented on the proposed study, including his expectation that it be unbiased and does not draw conclusions. He added that there should be a time limit so the study will not be delayed. Commissioner Wolfson presented his dog and spoke about his experience adopting her from an LAAS shelter and detailed how her health improved after switching her to a plant-based diet.

GM Barnette provided an overview of the board report recommending that the Department report back to the Board with a feasibility analysis and that the analysis should include:

- A. Thorough, cited, scientific research and expert testimony assessing the nutritional pros and cons about AAFCO approved, plant-based diets for dogs.
- B. Thorough, cited, scientific research about the impact of meat-based dog food on all animals, and the environment.
- C. A thorough cost-benefit analysis that includes a five year cost projection, with the goal of identifying cost-neutral solutions, and recommended funding sources if additional funding is required.
- D. Two potential options for a pilot plan designed to have minimal impact on shelters and dogs, conducted with oversight from an academic partner and information on how these pilots would fit into a full implementation plan.

GM Barnette stated that academic documents on plant-based or meat-based food can be gathered; a City analyst can sort the data and list the pros and cons on both sides. She stated that conclusions will not be drawn. **Commissioner Dicker** asked for clarification on the protocol. **GM** Barnette proposed that the study list the pros and cons found on the articles along with providing the articles themselves.

Public Comment:

Dr. Armaiti May: Identified herself as a local practicing veterinarian and read a letter from veterinarian Sarah Dodd in support of a plant-based diet.

Kim Delgado King: Relayed that Dr. Sarah Dodd states that plant-based diets for dogs are as suitable as any other diet formulated according to AAFCO recommendations.

Lisa Karlan: Stated that plant-based food has less caloric density than meat-based food and both diets can provide all the nutrients that an animal need. Ms. Karlan recommended an article written by Dr. Dodd.

Ally Iseman: Spoke on evacuation concerns; stated that money could be saved by switching to a plant-based diet; urged the Board to address all items as they are inter-connected systemic issues.

Dr. Sherstin Rosenberg: Identified herself as a veterinarian and spoke in favor of the proposal. Dr. Rosenberg spoke on health issues associated with meat-based diets and the benefits of plant-based diets.

Hilarey Benda: Identified herself as the founder and president of Beople's Buddies Animal Rescue, they consider themselves a plant-based rescue and stated that they have seen improvements in the dogs' health after switching to plant-based food.

Manuel Cabrales: Spoke in favor of feeding nutrient-rich plant-based diets to shelter animals and stated that it makes animals less aggressive.

Marla Tauscher: Stated that in principle she is not opposed to feeding dogs vegan food, although she has some questions, this topic is a P.R. stunt and LAAS has bigger problems.

Diana Mendoza: Identified herself as a member of PETA and spoke in favor of feeding plant-based diets to all LAAS shelter dogs.

Phyllis Daugherty: Identified herself as a member of Animal Issues Movement and stated that nobody in the Department is qualified to conduct a study; she stated that dogs are forced to be omnivores and asserted that they are still carnivores.

Natalie Harris: Spoke about the positive health effects both her and her dog experienced after switching to a vegan diet.

Stephanie Terronez: Urged the Board consider who funds the studies and the true cost of meat to the environment and animals. Ms. Terronez spoke about feeding her dogs a plant-based diet.

Gail Raff: Provided the current count of dogs and cats in LAAS shelters and spoke in support of the feasibility study; spoke against feeding dogs a vegan diet; stated that adopters cannot afford vegan pet food; urged the Commissioners to volunteer at the shelters.

Karen Coyne: Spoke in favor of a plant-based diet and recounted her experience feeding her pet a vegan diet. Ms. Coyne urged that the study be done quickly.

Whitney Smith: Spoke in favor of the study; agreed that the majority of adopters cannot afford plant-based food; suggested remedies for the diarrhea.

Josh Liddy: Spoke against feeding vegan food to dogs and in favor of the data gathering process. Mr. Liddy stated that LAAS did not engage the community on this issue.

Ellie Laks: Identified herself as the founder of The Gentle Barn and spoke in favor of plant-based diets for dogs and recounted her experience with her own dogs. Ms. Laks offered to aid in the study.

Asher Brown: Stated that he was speaking on behalf of Dr. Reese Halter who couldn't attend due to the Thomas fire and is in favor of a plant-based diet for dogs citing environmental factors.

Renee Manuel: Spoke in favor of plant-based diets for dogs.

Gina Bonanno-Lemos: Stated that she is certified in vegan nutrition for people and spoke in favor of plant-based diets for dogs.

Zoe Rosenberg: Identified herself as the founder of Happy Hen Chicken Rescue and spoke in favor of plant-based diets.

Jay Weiner: Identified himself as a founder of The Gentle Barn Foundation and spoke in support of the study and offered to provide information; spoke in favor of a plant-based diet for dogs.

Tiffany Hernandez: Spoke in favor of a plant-based diet for dogs and in favor of the study; is concerned about how adopters can continue the diet.

Constantin Philippou: Spoke in favor of a plant-based diet for dogs and feels the report will be biased; urged the report be done quickly.

Paige Parsons Roache: Spoke in favor of research for a healthy diet for animals.

Amy Jean Davis: Spoke in favor of the study and in favor of vegan food for dogs; stated that Natural Balance vegan dog food is the same price as the Canidae Life Stages fed to shelter dogs.

Patricia Todd: Identified herself as a volunteer dog-walker at a local shelter and spoke in favor of the feasibility study and is in favor of a plant-based diet for shelter dogs.

Daniel Eckhardt: Requested that the study be done quickly and efficiently and spoke in favor of plan-based diet for shelter animals.

Chelsea Glauber: Identified herself as a local worker's compensation attorney and requested that the report be taken seriously and be treated as if it were a legal document and exclude hearsay; requested to know all sources and payrolls of the sources.

Prabhat Gautam: Spoke in favor of feasibility study and in favor plant-based diets. Mr. Gautam asked for a clear timeline on the study.

Ramin Saber: Spoke in favor of a plant-based diet for dogs and recommended a video called Farm to Fridge that shows what happens to the animals in factory farms.

Jeremy Gardiner: Identified himself as a local citizen and spoke in support of the feasibility study; believes there are many other issues LAAS should focus on;

stated that he listened to the audio of the last meeting and found the disrespect shown to the Chief Veterinarian and GM Barnette to be appalling.

Monique Lukens: Identified herself as a teacher and activist and spoke in favor of plant-based diets; asserted that the studies exist.

Andrew Brown: Spoke in favor of the feasibility study and believes the information is needed before a decision can be made on the underlying proposal; considered it a happy accident that the vote was delayed so that the work could be done to come to the right conclusion.

Tiffany Livoti: Identified herself as a college student of biology and environmental science and extended an offer to Commissioner Wolfson on behalf of her biology and science professors to assist with the studies.

Cindy Melendez: Identified herself as a participant in the LA Animal Save vigils and as a veterinary technician who worked with Best Friends and Dr. Armaiti May and spoke in favor of plant-based diets for dogs.

GM Barnette confirmed that she will accept any and all research and peerreviewed articles via her City email and asked to be copied on research sent to the Commissioners so that everything can be catalogued and accounted for. GM Barnette estimated that the report may be ready in 60 days; it will be a summary of the research with the source material attached. Commissioner Gross asked that the Department reach out to other shelter systems to find out why they are not feeding their dogs a plant-based diet and also get information from LAAS's veterinarians. GM Barnette stated the she does not care about opinions unless there are credentials and a basis in science. Commissioner Dicker would like the proposals for pilot programs to be ready at the time the study is presented. GM Barnette stated that to do so would extend the estimated time of completion to 90 days; 60 days would not be enough time for both the study and plans for pilot programs. Commissioner Wolfson would like to amend item D of the proposed study to include a third option for full implementation in all of the shelters. GM Barnette stated that she is concerned that would entail throwing out the food currently being fed to the dogs instead of gradually phasing it out. Commissioner Wolfson stated that food should not be wasted and is asking for three implementation options to be available on the report comprised of plans for two pilot programs and a plan for full implementation which would involve no additional cost or impact. Commissioner Finsten mentioned that the City's procurement process is complicated and stated that item C of the proposed study should clearly spell out the procurement policy in order to avoid backing the Department into a corner that could end up costing money; recommended consulting GSD for advice. Commissioner Gross advised that full implementation may not be feasible. Commissioner Wolfson clarified that it would be a full implementation in however long that is going to take and would take into account the existing food supply. Commissioner Dicker added that when the feasibility analysis is heard in 60 days, it would contain items A, B and C then the Board can ask the Department to report back in 30 days with item D, the plans for two pilot programs and a plan for full implementation. None objected to adding the option for full implementation to item D. Commissioner Wolfson agreed with Commissioner Finsten on item C and mentioned that he had hoped

to amend item C to include an explanation of the procurement process, including an overview of what would be required so that a change in procurement could be cost-neutral to the Department, require no additional funding and not require the involvement of City Council. GM Barnette replied that she doubts that they can avoid including City Council. Commissioner Finsten added that the Board does not have the ability to make decisions about procurement. GM Barnette agreed with Commissioner Finsten and added that City Council will probably want to look at the procurement process. Commissioner Wolfson clarified that he wants item C of the report to include a description of what the procurement process is and how this could be structured to be cost-neutral and not require the involvement of City Council. Commissioner Finsten suggested just adding language to C about the procurement process. Commissioner Wolfson questioned the language for the five year cost projection, including that it seems misleading and as if it is not going to be cost-neutral. Commissioner Gross stated that it may be that the City does contracts on a five year basis. Commissioner Finsten and GM Barnette agreed with Commissioner Gross. None objected to amending item C to include the procurement process. Commissioner Wolfson would like to add an item E to the report that reflects the timeframe of 60 days. None objected to adding item E to reflect the timeframe. Commissioner Wolfson stated that the pros and cons of feeding meat-based food to dogs should be added to the report. GM Barnette stated that the language is already included in item B.

Commissioner Garcia made a motion to accept the recommendation and move forward with the report. **Commissioner Dicker** seconded and the motion was approved by a unanimous vote of 5-0.
