**AGENDAS** - The Board of Animal Services Commissioners (Board) meets regularly every second (2<sup>nd</sup>) and fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) Tuesday of each month at 9:00 A.M. Regular Meetings are held at City Hall, 200 North Spring Street, Room 1060, in Los Angeles, CA 90012. Evening Meetings are held in various locations throughout the City, from 7:00 to approximately 9:30 P.M. The agendas for Board meetings contain a brief general description of those items to be considered at the meetings. Board Agendas are available at the Department of Animal Services (Department), Administrative Division, 221 North Figueroa Street, 6<sup>th</sup> Floor, Suite 600, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Board Agendas may also be viewed on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor Public Bulletin Board in City Hall East, 200 North Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Internet users may also access copies of present and prior agenda items, copies of the Board Calendar, MP-3 audio files of meetings as well as electronic copies of approved minutes on the Department's World Wide Web Home Page site at <http://www.laanimalservices.com/CommissionAgendas.htm>

Three (3) members of the Board constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Some items on the Agenda may be approved without any discussion.

The Board Secretary will announce the items to be considered by the Board. The Board will hear the presentation on the topic and gather additional information from Department Staff. Once presentations have finished, the Board President will ask if any Board Member or member of the public wishes to speak on one or more of these items. Each speaker called before the Commission will have one (1) minute to express their comments and concerns on matters placed on the agenda. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes.)

**PUBLIC INPUT AT BOARD MEETINGS** – **Public Participation on Agenda Items.** Members of the public will have an opportunity to address the Board on agenda items after the item is called and before the Board takes action on the item, unless the opportunity for public participation on the item was previously provided to all interested members of the public at a public meeting of a Committee of the Board and the item has not substantially changed since the Committee heard the item. When speaking to an agenda item other than during Public Comment (see Public Comment below), the speaker shall limit his or her comments to the specific item under consideration (California Government Code, Section 54954.3).

**Public Comment.** The Board will provide an opportunity for public comment at every regular meeting of the Board. Members of the public may address the Board on any items within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board as part of Public Comment.

**Speaker Cards.** Members of the public wishing to speak are to fill out one speaker card for each agenda item on which they wish to speak and present it to the Board secretary **before** the item is called.

**Time Limit for Speakers.** Speakers addressing the Board will be limited to one (1) minute of speaking time for each agenda item except during general public comment period which is limited to two (2) minutes per speaker. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes each.). The Chairperson, with the approval of a majority of the Board, may for good cause extend any speaker's time by increments of up to one (1) minute.

**Brown Act.** These rules shall be interpreted in a manner that is consistent with the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section § 54950 et seq.

**STANDARDS OF CONDUCT.** Speakers are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from personal attacks or use of profanity or language that may incite violence.

All persons present at Board meetings are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from disrupting the meeting, interfering with the rights of others to address the Board and/or interfering with the conduct of business by the Board.

In the event that any speaker does not comply with the foregoing requirements, or if a speaker does not address the specific item under consideration, the speaker may be ruled out of order, their speaking time forfeited and the Chairperson may call upon the next speaker.

The Board, by majority vote, may order the removal from the meeting of any speaker or audience member continuing to behave in a disruptive manner after being warned by the Chairperson regarding their behavior. Section 403 of the California Penal Code states as follows: "Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor."

**VOTING AND DISPOSITION OF ITEMS** – Most items require a majority vote of the entire membership of the Board (3 members). When debate on an item is completed, the Board President will instruct the Secretary to "call the roll". Every member present must vote for or against each item; abstentions are not permitted unless there is a Conflict of Interest for which the Board member is obliged to abstain from voting. The Secretary will announce the votes on each item. Any member of the Board may move to "reconsider" any vote on any item on the agenda, except to adjourn, suspend the Rules, or where an intervening event has deprived the Board of jurisdiction, providing that said member originally voted on the prevailing side of the item. The motion to "reconsider" shall only be in order once during the meeting, and once during the next regular meeting. The member requesting reconsideration shall identify for all members present the Agenda number and subject matter previously voted upon. A motion to reconsider is not debatable and shall require an affirmative vote of three members of the Board.

When the Board has failed by sufficient votes to approve or reject an item, and has not lost jurisdiction over the matter, or has not caused it to be continued beyond the next regular meeting, the issue is again placed on the next agenda for the following meeting for the purpose of allowing the Board to again vote on the matter.

**SUBJECT: REQUEST AUTHORITY TO CONTINUE TO SPONSOR AND HOST BOUND ANGELS UNIVERSITY**

### BOARD ACTION RECOMMENDED:

**APPROVE** that Los Angeles Animal Services continue to sponsor and host BOUND ANGELS UNIVERSITY at one of the Los Angeles Animal Services centers.

### BACKGROUND:

Animal Control Officers, Animal Care Technicians, and Veterinary Technicians handle a variety of dogs throughout their workday. Some of the animals are fractious, afraid, injured or sick. Learning to anticipate the possible dangerous behaviors that could result and responding with the appropriate handling techniques, as well as learning behavior characteristics of certain breed types will give our staff an increased level of confidence and increase their safety.

BOUND ANGELS UNIVERSITY has provided regular canine behavior classes to benefit our Animal Care Staff. To date, seventy-eight Animal Care Technicians, Animal Care Technician Supervisors, and Volunteers have participated in this training. This training gives our staff and volunteers the information that is often requested by adopters and New Hope Partners when they are deciding which dogs to pull from our shelters. This information is important to prepare the adopter and to prevent recidivism.

A copy of the BOUND ANGELS UNIVERSITY outline is attached.

### SUMMARY:

We received positive feedback from staff and we believe this training on canine behavior is a valuable tool and is the key to saving even more lives and preventing recidivism.

# Bound Angels University

Since the inception of Bound Angels University just 2 years ago in February 2016 we have hosted more than **152** dog handlers, ACT's, shelter staff, management and volunteers from **30** municipalities throughout California and the USA including **all 6 LA Animal Services Shelters** with **zero** cost to LAAS.

All participants, including the **78** from LA Animal Services shelters, have completed 24 hours of intensive training (over 3 days) including hands-on shelter dog handling, classroom theory, dog handling safety plus Structured Managed Dog Playgroup training. In each program we used adoptable dogs residing in the LA Shelter system. We have seen dogs adopted directly from our playgroups and trainings.

Each participant of Bound Angels University took away a much better understanding of how to save shelter dogs, a better understanding of dog's drives, behaviors, breeds, theory and safety.

As you can see in our testimonials ([youtube.com/BoundAngels](https://youtube.com/BoundAngels)), participants left our program with a new outlook on their jobs, increased morale and a motivation to implement these lifesaving techniques and **save more shelter dogs**.

Undoubtedly the kill rate at these shelters is declining, LRR is increasing, adoptions are up, and people are much better able to perform their jobs safely.

Giving shelters the tools to save more lives has a multifold effect: It increases adoptions, increases the public's perception of our nation's shelters and benefits the quality of life we give our shelter dogs.

# Bound Angels University

\* OUTLINE \*

*A complete training program covering canine behavior in a shelter environment.*

Understanding canine behavior is the key to saving even more lives. If every shelter had a trainer / behaviorist on staff that understood (and could work with) the various temperaments of shelter dogs we could easily double our LRR and greatly reduce recidivism.

*This is the goal of the Bound Angels University:*

***Give every shelter employee the skills to safely & effectively work with dogs in their care!***

Bound Angels University is an intensive 3 day / 24-hour training program that welcomes 10-15 participants from shelters throughout the country. It is hosted monthly at the LAAS West LA Shelter and we plan to make more training, available as demand dictates.

Participants meet the following guidelines:

- Each participant is employed at a municipal shelter; humane society or SPCA and participation must be approved by his or her supervisor.
- Participant's work as ACT's, Behaviorists / Trainers or employees whose primary job it is handling dogs.
- With supervisor approval, advanced volunteers may participate in training.

Shelters are selected by criteria including their mission to save more lives, LRR, demographics as well as an application process. Shelters are invited to participate in training at no cost to their shelter. This is a scholarship-based program and we hope to make further scholarships available to cover transportation costs – grants and funds permitting. Initially the only expense shelters would incur is transportation to our training and accommodations.

The Bound Angels University curriculum is based on our experience implementing life-saving programs in large municipal shelters as well as small humane societies. Training includes theory based, classroom instruction, as well as hands on dog handling training including engagement training, working with and understanding fearful and dominant dogs, basic dog handling skills including safely removing dogs from kennels, safely handling dogs around other dogs and people, behavior observations / assessments as well as Structured Managed Playgroup Training.

Each day of training focuses on a unique aspect of shelter-canine behavior.

**Day 1: Canine Behavior Theory:** During the theory portion of the training participants learn (in classroom format) the various breeds, drives, temperaments, situations, benefits and pitfalls of working with (shelter) dogs. Understanding the basics of the canine personality and how to work with it in the often-stressful shelter setting. Topics covered include:

- Understanding various breeds and groups of dogs
- Safely handling dogs in a shelter setting
- Mitigating Animal Related Injuries in the Shelter Environment
- Safely leashing and handling dogs in and out of their kennels
- Understanding the drives of dogs and identifying them for safety and proper placement



- The Theory of Engagement Training
- The Various Dog Training Methods and their benefits
- Proper tools for working with and handling dogs
- Identifying Canine Body-language for safe handling
- Understanding Dog's Senses
- Video instruction & discussion highlighting dangerous dog situation and avoidance

**Day 2: Understanding and Working with Canine Behavior – Engagement Training:** During the behavior training section we focus on understanding a dog's behavior in the shelter environment and how it may be different from the dog's true personality. This is a hands-on training day handling dogs, working dogs and learning to assess the behavior of each dog students work with. How can we use the behaviors we see? How can we modify the behaviors through engagement and training to help save more lives? Reading the behavior of dogs with people, other dogs, around toys and distractions is covered as well as understanding what potential homes and people might be best suited for each individual dog. On day 2 we also cover the application of the theory-lessons learned on Day One.

- Safely handling dogs in shelter setting
- Walking dogs through kennels
- Safely leashing dogs in and out of their kennels
- Avoiding fights in tight areas
- Engaging dogs
- Hands on with basic canine behavior and safe handling skills
- Proper tools for working with and handling dogs
- Reading temperaments, behaviors and drives of shelter dogs
- Dog to dog introductions

\*\*\* This has proven to be the most exciting and rewarding training according to our survey of participants.

***Understanding and applying engagement training  
is clearly the most effective way to get a dog adopted!***

**Day 3: Structured Managed Playgroups:** Playgroup training brings all the pieces together. Once students learn the basics of *canine behavior theory*, body language and drives, we now teach students the importance of the canine pack drive. Our playgroup training is very different from others in that we manage our groups and *teach* the dogs the skills they need to get along. We safely introduce the dogs and control the dog in very humane methods to prevent injuries to dogs and people. Playgroups, properly structured, can increase the health of dogs and increase adoptions as well as increase the public's perception of the shelter environment.

- How to safely bring dogs into small, medium and large groups
- Which dogs are best matched to play together
- How to introduce dogs into and remove dogs from playgroups
- How to monitor behavior in the groups
- How to handle scuffles and how to prevent scuffles from becoming dangerous
- How to stay safe in the event of a dogfight

- How to read dog body-language in the group dynamic

Benefits to LAAS for a strategic alignment include:

- LAAS employees are granted 20% of slots per session benefitting in increased training for staff. *We have had months in which that percentage was much higher and we welcome employees, staff as well as senior volunteers (with supervisor approval). We've never said no to a LAAS employee request.*
- LAAS shelter dogs have benefited immensely from our training and interaction, as well as exposure for potential adoptions.
- Positive PR and exposure for LAAS has been immense. Social media exposure showcasing the dogs and the life-saving mission of LAAS has been incredible. The public loves watching our trainings and we have had countless dogs adopted right out of our training and playgroups.
- Goodwill in helping countless shelters nationwide to learn the skills to save more lives. We have hosted more than 152 participants from 30 municipalities throughout the US.

*We hope to continue to provide this lifesaving program with LA Animal Services.*

**SUBJECT: REQUEST TO USE FUNDS FROM THE ANIMAL WELFARE TRUST FUND FOR  
STAFF REGISTRATION FOR THE 2018 BEST FRIENDS NATIONAL CONFERENCE**

**BOARD ACTION RECOMMENDED:**

**APPROVE** the use of the Animal Welfare Trust Fund in the amount of \$8,250 to register approximately thirty (30) employees for the 2018 Best Friends National Conference located in Los Angeles.

**BACKGROUND:**

Best Friends, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, is a leader in the nationwide movement to end the killing of dogs and cats in America's animal shelters by the year 2025. Annually, the Best Friends organization holds an informative and well-received animal welfare conference. This year, the conference will be held in Downtown Los Angeles at the Westin Bonaventure Hotel and Suites. The close proximity of the conference affords the Department of Animals Services the opportunity to send many more employees. The Department has received a discount code that will allow registrants to attend at a cost of \$275 per person. Approval of the amount of \$8,250 will pay the registration fee for 30 employees.

**SUMMARY:**

The use of this funding will allow the Department to register approximately thirty (30) employees to attend this conference. The conference will cover topics such as Adoptions and Animal Care – A Lifesaving Playbook; Getting Down with Data; Shaping your No-Kill Community; and Lifesaving Technology – Innovative Solutions Anyone Can Use. These topics, along with many others will provide our staff with up-to-date industry education and a nationwide perspective of how the City can attain its goals in animal welfare. As it is costly to send staff to the out of town conferences, this year the Department can offer this opportunity to more employees than usual. Employees who are approved to attend this conference will be asked to share the knowledge and experience gained from this conference with the remaining staff.


