Evening Meetings are held in various locations throughout the City, from 7:00 to approximately 9:30 P.M. The agendas for Board meetings contain a brief general description of those items to be considered at the meetings. Board Agendas are available at the Department of Animal Services (Department), Administrative Division, 221 North Figueroa Street, 6th Floor, Suite 600, Los Angeles, CA 90012. The Board Secretary will announce the items to be considered by the Board. The Board will hear the presentation on the topic and gather additional information from Department Staff. Once presentations have finished, the Board President will ask if any Board Member or member of the public wishes to speak on one or more of these items. Each speaker called before the Commission will have one (1) minute to express their comments and concerns on matters placed on the agenda. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes.)

<u>PUBLIC INPUT AT BOARD MEETINGS</u> – Public Participation on Agenda Items. Members of the public will have an opportunity to address the Board on agenda items after the item is called and before the Board takes action on the item, unless the opportunity for public participation on the item was previously provided to all interested members of the public at a public meeting of a Committee of the Board and the item has not substantially changed since the

Committee heard the item. When speaking to an agenda item other than during Public Comment (see Public Comment below), the speaker shall limit his or her comments to the specific item under consideration (California Government Code, Section 54954.3).

Public Comment. The Board will provide an opportunity for public comment at every regular meeting of the Board. Members of the public may address the Board on any items within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board as part of Public Comment.

Speaker Cards. Members of the public wishing to speak are to fill out one speaker card for each agenda item on which they wish to speak and present it to the Board secretary **<u>before</u>** the item is called.

Time Limit for Speakers. Speakers addressing the Board will be limited to one (1) minute of speaking time for each agenda item except during general public comment period which is limited to two (2) minutes per speaker. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes each.). The Chairperson, with the approval of a majority of the Board, may for good cause extend any speaker's time by increments of up to one (1) minute.

Brown Act. These rules shall be interpreted in a manner that is consistent with the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section § 54950 et seq.

<u>STANDARDS OF CONDUCT.</u> Speakers are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from personal attacks or use of profanity or language that may incite violence.

All persons present at Board meetings are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from disrupting the meeting, interfering with the rights of others to address the Board and/or interfering with the conduct of business by the Board.

In the event that any speaker does not comply with the foregoing requirements, or if a speaker does not address the specific item under consideration, the speaker may be ruled out of order, their speaking time forfeited and the Chairperson may call upon the next speaker.

The Board, by majority vote, may order the removal from the meeting of any speaker or audience member continuing to behave in a disruptive manner after being warned by the Chairperson regarding their behavior. Section 403 of the California Penal Code states as follows: "Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor."

VOTING AND DISPOSITION OF ITEMS – Most items require a majority vote of the entire membership of the Board (3 members). When debate on an item is completed, the Board President will instruct the Secretary to "call the roll". Every member present must vote for or against each item; abstentions are not permitted unless there is a Conflict of Interest for which the Board member is obliged to abstain from voting. The Secretary will announce the votes on each item. Any member of the Board may move to "reconsider" any vote on any item on the agenda, except to adjourn, suspend the Rules, or where an intervening event has deprived the Board of jurisdiction, providing that said member originally voted on the prevailing side of the item. The motion to "reconsider" shall only be in order once during the meeting, and once during the next regular meeting. The member requesting reconsideration shall identify for all members present the Agenda number and subject matter previously voted upon. A motion to reconsider is not debatable and shall require an affirmative vote of three members of the Board.

When the Board has failed by sufficient votes to approve or reject an item, and has not lost jurisdiction over the matter, or has not caused it to be continued beyond the next regular meeting, the issue is again placed on the next agenda for the following meeting for the purpose of allowing the Board to again vote on the matter.

Meeting called to order at 9:12 a.m. Commissioners present were García, Gross, Sandoval and Wolfson. Also present from Los Angeles Animal Services (LAAS) was General Manager (GM) Brenda Barnette, Assistant General Manager (AGM) Tammy Watson, AGM MeLissa Webber, and Assistant City Attorney (ACA) Dov Lesel.

Commissioner Gross opened the meeting, introduced staff and provided an overview of the meeting agenda.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS

 Dangerous Animal Case: DA 182566 WLA (Item was heard after Board Reports) Appellant(s): Stephen and Wendy Lubianetsky West Los Angeles Animal Services Center: Lieutenant Yvonne Rodriguez Complaining Witness: Andrew and Victoria Custer

The Board discussed the merits of the appeal, the evidence provided to the Hearing Examiner, and the grounds supporting the General Manager's determination. The Board found that the evidence supports the decision of the General Manager's determination.

Commissioner Gross made motion to uphold the General Manager's decision.

Commissioner Sandoval seconded and the motion was approved by a vote of 4-0.

Assistant City Attorney Dov Lesel informed the appellants that they would be receiving something in writing and would also have the opportunity to contact the General Manager about their third dog, the one that was clearly not involved, Brownie; and that the General Manager may allow a reissuance of that license but that they needed to contact the Department once they got get the letter from the Department with the results of today's hearing.

II. REGULAR COMMISSION MEETING

1. PUBLIC COMMENT

Zoey Knittel from Spay/Neuter Project of LA – Thanked the Department for all the hard work. Also wanted to show appreciation for the vouchers for free spay/neuter for cats in the month of August. She stated they just celebrated their 200,000th fixed pet in Los Angeles a few months ago and through their last 12 years of experience they have seen cat owners take full advantage of promotions. SNP/LA saw a 10% increase in the number of cats that came in to be fixed in April when the Department did the free cat program and they expect to see a tremendous result from this program in August. Knittel thanked the Department again for all their work and really appreciated the notice going out at the beginning of the month from LAAS, so that their social team could jump on that and start promoting it as well.

Commissioner Gross thanked them for all of their good work.

Hartley Sawyer – Stated that he is a long-time volunteer at SLA, Chesterfield Square. He stated that recently the training yard was cut in half by a permanent fence. The fence has safety concerns and has rendered the yard considerably less effective and in some cases unusable for important tasks that staff and volunteers have been undertaking for many years. Sawyer stated his question today was simple, why change the best piece of infrastructure we have left at Chesterfield that is the beating heart of our shelter without alerting or giving some kind of space for feedback and input on its design. The design is flawed. Sawyer expressed deep concern for fellow volunteers and staff alike because he has never seen the atmosphere of that shelter more toxic and the morale more hopeless. Sawyer stated that volunteers break into tears due to the overwhelming sense that LAAS does not value what we do. Sawyer asked for respect, transparency; some more inclusiveness so that decisions can be made with all the input taken into account to have the best possible end result.

4. ORAL REPORT OF THE GENERAL MANAGER

GM Barnette discussed the following:

- From August 1st to the 12th, 621 vouchers have been issued. At this time 36 have been redeemed.
- A lot going on in particular training for fosters for kittens; the only thing that is saving us right now because there are so many kittens coming in.
- The volunteers at SLA Chesterfield Square continue to provide our dogs with special attention during their stay; they have regular parties for the dogs.
- The Boredom Busters grant at SLA is being extended to other shelters as well.
- The Boys/Girl Scouts have been doing a lot too; they put together bags of treats, toys and leashes for the animals to take home with them after they were adopted. We love working with the scouts.
- On July 25 our Lifesaving and Volunteer liaisons received training on rabbit housing, care, diet, adoption and bonding from long-time volunteer and president of the L.A. Rabbit Foundation, Michele Kelly.
- We are working on taking our weekly report that we send to the Mayor and turning it into a newsletter for the Commission. We haven't forgotten, but we are a little bit under water as far as being able to do all the paperwork that is required, but that is still coming.
- We recently had a bust of 40 little dogs; last account 26 had been adopted; more may have been adopted by now.
- Getting ready for "Clear the Shelters" which is always a huge time for us. The first year that we had "Clear the Shelters", I think we were the top adoption shelters in the country. We get all kinds of promotion locally and nationally for that and it's a really big deal and it helps us.
- From time to time we get complaints of the small animals that get sold in Santee Alley, and they are not always small; sometimes they are rabbits. Our staff did an unexpected raid last week. This time we seized about 30 tiny little turtles. What is important is that turtles carry Salmonella, and people without realizing that buy them for their children, thinking that this is an easy pet at home, but it's not.
- We found that not everybody is not always getting the word when someone has had any kind of injury or any kind of accident, so that we can follow up with the families and that sort of thing. So we are working on this reporting directive so that people will know how to share that information with Tammy and I, and then we will be able to share it with you.
- From January to July our intake of cats is up 14% and of kittens is up 21%; that is huge and that is crippling to us. For example cats went from 6007 the same time of last year to 6835 this year.

- Kittens went from 6646 to 8054 in the same time last year. Dogs are down 4%; they dropped 13268 to 12788. So the live save rate for cats is 84.27%, it's up 2%; for kittens 85.93%, it's down 2%. Dogs is 94.44%; up 1%. We still have our biggest struggle with the kittens. That is why spay/neuter month is so important to help drive that down a little bit. The overall live save rate year to date is 89.45%; same time last year it was 89.39%. So we are a little bit ahead but we are still not leaps and bounds ahead.
- I think most of you saw the rescue of Sunny, the big, thoroughbred. He was tangled in a fence at his owner's property and when they were getting her out of the fence, somehow he fell down a cliff. With a combined effort of our SMART team and of the Fire Department, we got him in a sling. The Fire Department brought the helicopter and lifted him out; and all is well. That was probably our most dramatic rescue of the month.

Commissioner Gross had three questions.

1) In regards to the vouchers, struggle with the cats/kittens. Have we expended all those funds? If we haven't expended, can we continue to have free vouchers?

Brenda Barnette stated this year, we just said we were doing it for the month of August; there is not really an extension because we gave a time limit. We're just trying to get the word out as much as possible. The one limitation because of the injunction, it is for pet cats only and 3 per household. So that might slow it down a little bit. All of the cats that go out of our shelters are spayed/neutered before they leave.

2) Is there any update of the hiring of the new board secretary?

Tammy Watson stated that the interviews are being held tomorrow, the selection will be determined by Friday, and hopefully have a job offer made, and a start date by September 2nd.

Brenda Barnette one thing that I forgot to mention, the County has adopted a program that comes out of Colorado about the way they care about animals in the shelters. Couple of thoughts on that, several people before I made any comment at all, read it and said they really can't see philosophically that there is anything different than a No Kill program; and it was very eloquently stated and explained by a couple of groups who do not use the term No Kill. So it opened up a very healthy, until yesterday, conversation between people who are the leadership teams across the state. There are a couple of major differences; one, Colorado does not have a cat problem like we have. so it doesn't really deal with feral cats, community cats or anything like that. The other thing is that at the bottom of the her press release, Marcia did say if you have any concerns about No Kill, and she referred us to the PETA website. Which I think actually was a bit of a fire storm for the State Cal animals and was unfortunate, because we are 30 years into the term No Kill and most people aren't slinging them around that much; if you go to our website and see Defining No Kill for L.A. City, you will see that it is a very moderate, sensible program; and it is practically word for word about what the Colorado program is, except we have cats here. So we really need to get past arguing over terminology. It's a City policy and has been a policy since at least 2003. Changing that policy would be confusing to the public. It would take Commission action, PAW Committee action, City Council action and require the signature of the Mayor.

3) Volunteers at SLA. I know we can't discuss this item, but wanted to know if you had any reaction to Issues that were raised about the fence. –

Brenda Barnette we used King wire, who is the company who works with GSD and who has done a lot of the work around the kennels, shelters and they came in and did a drawing and design. We came to you for permission to put the fence up, so if they volunteers watch the agenda, they will know exactly what is being discussed publically, because this wasn't done in any kind of a secret. As a matter fact I think knew that I was down there saying about the temporary one, oh we can't do this; so then they got busy and had to get bids. I don't know about the communication between the Volunteer Liaisons and the volunteers, and what their specific concerns are about why it's not good now, but they certainly should use their chain of communication; they should talk to their volunteer liaison who should talk to the District Supervisor who should talk to the Director of Field Operations who should talk to MeLissa.

6. Board Reports

A. Authorize the Use of Animal Welfare Trust Fund for Extension of Misting System on the Training Field at Chesterfield Square Animal Services Center

MeLissa Webber presented. The Misting System at Chesterfield currently does not go into the training kennel attached to the play yard. We'd like to extend the Misting System to cover those areas for relief from the weather while they are in the play yards or in the training kennels. The cost is \$23,128.

Commissioner Sandoval asked if all the shelters have the misting systems; **MeLissa Webber** stated all the shelters have some kind of misting system; they don't all have them in the yards. This started because the training kennels that are attached to the play yards housed dogs at times, so that was the concern and then extending it to the training kennels that are attached to the play yards, we figured go ahead and do the whole play yard too. It didn't up the price that much to do the whole play yard.

Brenda Barnette – Some of you may be thinking that you can put the sprinkler system up a lot less expensively as I probably could. We have to go through the process, and use certain vendors, we have to use certain standards that are approved by GSD because they are actually the owners of the building, we are the users; and some of it has to do with safety, insurance, so there are a lot of reasons why it does sometimes seem like it costs more to do things in the city.

Public Comment:

Danielle Howard - Volunteer at SLA, I just wanted to focus the part that kennels are used on a daily basis in conjunction with various weather conditions, so I'm asking that you take into consideration other things in relation to refurbishing the kennels while misters are great, what about other weather conditions. If we are going to keep the dogs in the training kennels, I think one of the most important things that they need besides misters, is a continuous fresh source of water. Not only that those kennel shelves that are in there; I don't know if you have seen them in the training kennels, but there are kennel shelves there they are a hazard to the dogs, especially to an active dogs; and they really need to be removed. I'm not sure if you are aware, but there was a dog named Oso who died in one the training kennels thought to be by broken back from jumping around in the kennel. Another dog bumped his head last week, jumping around from excitement in the kennel.

Commission Gross - Sometime back I raised the issue of generally speaking on the conditions in regards to climate change or changing weather, whether we need to look at revamping the shelters and I believe Councilmember Koretz put in a motion.

Brenda Barnette - There is an evaluation is being done of all the shelters, looking at those things. It's never simple. Getting the waters repaired that are currently in place is about a work order from GSD, to get them to come in and do the repair work. I think what Danielle is recommending putting automatic waters into those training runs is a great idea, and we can get a bid on that and bring that back at another time. Those shelves were put in when we were going to use them for outdoor cats and they do need to come out; that's in the plans.

MeLissa Webber - We put in a work order for the shelves to come out after we presented the report back on the Capacity for Care.

Brenda Barnette – The other things we can look into like roofing, some of the play areas. We can look at the shelters where there are outdoor play yards if we can put something else in that would cover it. We can certainly look at that, probably worthwhile. We can look on how much coverage we can put on the outdoor play yards.

Commissioner Gross – Fantastic. Thank you for those suggestions; you're welcome to keep on us so we follow through on this.

Commissioner Wolfson made a motion to approve the use of the Animal Welfare Trust Fund for Extension of Misting System on the Training Field at Chesterfield Square Animal Services Center.

Commission Sandoval seconded and the motion was approved by a unanimous vote of 4-0.

C. Report Back on the posting of spay/neuter billboards at the Services Centers.

MeLissa Webber – passed along pictures of the spay/neuter posters at 4 of the 6 shelters. We don't have the pictures in the print form for East Valley and North, however, signs are up at each of the shelters. A minimum of two English and two Spanish signs in the lobbies of each of the shelters.

Brenda Barnette - we did restock all of flyers and brochures at the end of the last fiscal year, so we are working now on a system to get staff when they come for the Woofstat meetings or something like that on a regular basis, to inventory what they have at the shelter and go back and fill their information/flyer holder things.

Public Comment: None.

D. Report Back on the purchasing of bumper stickers with Department priorities on them (e.g. spay and neuter, adopt).

Commissioner Gross – this was an item I raised because I was on the 101 behind an Animal Services truck and I saw there was bumper sticker there that talked about animal cruelty. We should have spay/neuter and licensing, that it's a good opportunity.

Justin Khosrowabadi - stated he created a template for bumper stickers so that we can promote our Department. So the first one has Adopt, Foster, Donate; and for Spay/Neuter – it says End Unwanted Litters; Commissioner Sandoval asked if there was a phone number on there. Justin indicated that the website is on there, that they can add the phone. Commissioner Sandoval asked what size: Standard bumper stickers. 3in by 11 inches.

Commissioner García suggested "Spay/Neuter it's the law"

Commissioner Gross suggested adding a bumper sticker about licensing; and asked for a timeline.

Tammy Watson – stated the bumper stickers were priced through GSD and the price is much higher than a non-GSD vendor; so we are checking to see which we can make the purchase through.

GSD was about \$3,000 for 1000 bumper stickers, but the outside vendor was 5000 bumper stickers for \$2,000; it was a big difference so looking into it. Looking at the options of making the purchase and we can certainly have the option identified before the end of this month then we can move forward with the purchase.

Commissioner García asked about magnetic stickers to put on the trucks.

Commissioner Gross thanked Justin for all the social media and website updates; great job.

Public Comment:

Zoey Knittel – We so appreciate you getting the word out about the free spay/neuter programs and vouchers program; one issue my clients have experienced with the website portal so that people can print at home, is there are two sections on the form that are mandatory in order to be submitted and those are type of id and id number; in 2016 there was a motion passed that allowed people to go into the shelters to get these vouchers using a self-identification affidavit, we were wondering if the website could also mirror that system and have an affidavit; not make the people that are applying fill out the identification id number and type.

Brenda Barnette – What Zoey is talking about is that when you go into the shelter if you show a piece of mail that shows where you live, that you can self-identify. I don't think that we do that online, but we can look into it and see if it is possible to do that online.

Commissioner García asked is the affidavit something you just sign, in place of showing a piece of id.

Brenda Barnette stated that we do have them show for some of the mobile vans, a piece of mail. If they don't have any other piece of id to show, they show a piece of mail that shows that they live in the City of L.A. That's all we are trying to do, that they live in the City; we're not trying to find out anything else; and we purposely did that so that we wouldn't frightened undocumented people from being able to use the services. So I think you bring up a good point; let us look into it, and see what we can come up with.

Commissioner Gross asked if they could scan and can upload it.

Brenda Barnette stated that she always say yes you can do anything with a computer but I'm not the IT supervisor, so we can look at it.

Commissioner García stated perhaps there can be a pdf they can download and then upload instead of the ID.
