AGENDAS - The Board of Animal Services Commissioners (Board) meets regularly every second (2nd) and fourth (4th) Tuesday of each month at 9:30 A.M. For the duration of the COVID-19 emergency, the Board will meet telephonically and using Zoom software in conformity with the Governor's Executive Order N-29-20 (March 17, 2020). The agendas for Board meetings contain a brief general description of those items to be considered at the meetings. Board Agendas are available at the Department of Animal Services (Department), Administrative Division, 221 North Figueroa Street, 6th Floor, Suite 600, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Board Agendas may also be viewed on the 2nd floor Public Bulletin Board in City Hall East, 200 North Main Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Internet users may also access copies of present and prior agenda items, copies of the Board Calendar, MP-3 audio files of meetings as well as electronic copies of approved minutes on the Department's World Wide Web Home Page site at <https://www.laanimalservices.com/about-us-2/commission/#three>

Three (3) members of the Board constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Some items on the Agenda may be approved without any discussion.

The Board Secretary will announce the items to be considered by the Board. The Board will hear the presentation on the topic and gather additional information from Department Staff. Once presentations have finished, the Board President will ask if any Board Member or member of the public wishes to speak on one or more of these items. Each speaker called before the Commission will have one (1) minute to express their comments and concerns on matters placed on the agenda. (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes.)

PUBLIC INPUT AT BOARD MEETINGS – Public Participation on Agenda Items. Members of the public will have an opportunity to address the Board on agenda items after the item is called and before the Board takes action on the item, unless the opportunity for public participation on the item was previously provided to all interested members of the public at a public meeting of a Committee of the Board and the item has not substantially changed since the Committee heard the item. When speaking to an agenda item other than during Public Comment (see Public Comment below), the speaker shall limit his or her comments to the specific item under consideration (California Government Code, Section 54954.3).

Public Comment. The Board will provide an opportunity for public comment at every regular meeting of the Board. Members of the public may address the Board on any items within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board as part of Public Comment. Each speaker will be granted a maximum of two minutes and the presiding officer reserves the ability to extend or limit the time depending on the circumstances of the meeting.

Notice to Paid Representatives. If you are compensated to monitor, attend, or speak at this meeting, City law may require you to register as a lobbyist and report your activity. See Los Angeles Municipal Code §§ 48.01 *et seq.* More information is available at ethics.lacity.org/lobbying. Time Limit for Speakers. Speakers addressing the Board will be limited to one (1) minute of speaking time for each agenda item except during the general public comment period, which is limited to two (2) minutes per speaker (For certain agenda items, speakers will have two (2) minutes each).

Brown Act. These rules shall be interpreted in a manner that is consistent with the Ralph M. Brown Act, California Government Code Section § 54950 et seq.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT. Speakers are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from personal attacks or use of profanity or language that may incite violence.

All persons present at Board meetings are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to refrain from disrupting the meeting, interfering with the rights of others to address the Board and/or interfering with the conduct of business by the Board.

In the event that any speaker does not comply with the foregoing requirements, or if a speaker does not address the specific item under consideration, the speaker may be ruled out of order, their speaking time forfeited and the Chairperson may call upon the next speaker.

The Board, by majority vote, may order the removal from the meeting of any speaker or audience member continuing to behave in a disruptive manner after being warned by the Chairperson regarding their behavior. Section 403 of the California Penal Code states as follows: "Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor."

VOTING AND DISPOSITION OF ITEMS – Most items require a majority vote of the entire membership of the Board (3 members). When debate on an item is completed, the Board President will instruct the Secretary to "call the roll". Every member present must vote for or against each item; abstentions are not permitted unless there is a Conflict of Interest for which the Board member is obliged to abstain from voting. The Secretary will announce the votes on each item. Any member of the Board may move to "reconsider" any vote on any item on the agenda, except to adjourn, suspend the Rules, or where an intervening event has deprived the Board of jurisdiction, providing that said member originally voted on the prevailing side of the item. The motion to "reconsider" shall only be in order once during the meeting, and once during the next regular meeting. The member requesting reconsideration shall identify for all members present the Agenda number and subject matter previously voted upon. A motion to reconsider is not debatable and shall require an affirmative vote of three members of the Board.

When the Board has failed by sufficient votes to approve or reject an item, and has not lost jurisdiction over the matter, or has not caused it to be continued beyond the next regular meeting, the issue is again placed on the next agenda for the following meeting for the purpose of allowing the Board to again vote on the matter.

Meeting called to order at 9:36 a.m. Commissioners present were Gross, García, and Cohen. Also present from Los Angeles Animal Services (LAAS) was General Manager (GM) Dana Brown, Assistant General Manager (AGM) Curtis Watts, Assistant General Manager (AGM) Annette Ramirez, Board Secretary Francine Acuña, and Deputy City Attorney Steve Houchin.

Commissioner Gross opened the meeting, introduced staff, provided an overview of the meeting agenda, and provided instructions to the public on how to make public comments for this virtual meeting.

I. REGULAR COMMISSION MEETING

1. PUBLIC COMMENT

Public Comment was made by:

- **Heather Michaels** - offered assistance to enhance additional programs to more effectively reopen the shelters and to help the relationship between the Department and the community.
- **David Moskowitz** - suggested the Department work with City Council on a spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits.
- **Sharon Tydell** - expressed the importance of implementing a spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits.
- **Michelle Cornelius** - asked if volunteers could receive the orange and STAR alert notifications and spoke about the discrepancies of dogs getting the flu vaccine.
- **Aliza Friedenburg** - asked the Department to prioritize making house rabbits legal in the City and to finalize the spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits.
- **Julie Bertrand** - shared her experiences with rabbit education and awareness and emphasized the needs for spay/neuter, allowing rabbits to be kept indoors, and limiting the amount of rabbits in a household.
- **Debbie Folsom** - asked for the municipal code to be changed to make house rabbits legal in the City, spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits, and setting a limit for how many rabbits can be in a home.

- **Whitney Smith** - spoke about the conflicting statements given regarding the canine influenza.
- **Anthony Folsom** - stated the municipal code needs to be changed to make house rabbits legal in the City.
- **June** - stated house rabbits need to be legal in the City and should be included as pets.
- **Katie Hartnett** - advocate for rabbits to be made legal companion animals and spoke about the importance of a spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits.
- **Sophia Chen** - stated a spay/neuter ordinance should be mandatory for rabbits and they should be acknowledged as indoor pets.
- **David Shapendonk** - stated rabbits should be allowed as indoor pets and supports a spay/neuter ordinance.
- **Cora Chandler** - stated the spay/neuter ordinance should include rabbits.
- **Sharina Alejo** - stated rabbits should be allowed as indoor pets and supports a spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits.
- **Cathy Serksnas** - asked for a follow-up on the dog named Hennessy and a report back on the STAR funds.
- **Gail Raff** - asked for an update on donations that have been made to the Community Cat Program, the flu vaccine, and to the STAR funds.
- **Jodie** - asked for house rabbits to be made legal in the City and supports a spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits.
- **Cathy** - stated that house rabbits should be made legal in the City and a limit should be placed on the number of rabbits per household. Supports the spay/neuter ordinance.
- **Pam Wilkinson** - stated the Community Cat Program needs to be implemented as soon as possible.
- **Jasmine Jones** - supports a spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits and suggested the Department look into how the County runs their community cat program.
- **Michelle Kelly** - expressed the importance of a spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits and to make them legal pets.
- **Megan Guerra** - asked to make house rabbits legal in the City of LA and supports a spay/neuter ordinance for rabbits.
- **Carrie** - stated it is time to update the laws and rabbits should be allowed as indoor pets.
- **Keisha** - advocate for the rabbits to be added to the companion animal spay and neuter mandate.
- **Michael Chia** - advocate for rabbits to be added to the spay and neuter mandate.

- **Michelle Cornelius** - requested that additional evening meetings be added.

4. ORAL REPORT OF THE GENERAL MANAGER

GM Dana Brown discussed the following:

- Provided an update on the canine influenza. As long as there are no new cases, the Department should be back to normal operations by the end of the month for West Valley and by December 5 for West LA.
- Vaccine mandate for employees is in full effect. Employees who are awaiting exemption decisions have already begun their weekly testing requirement and will be tested twice a week. Eight employees were sent home for non-compliance
- The Department is working with Western University who wants to subcontract the spay/neuter clinic at the North Central shelter to an organization called Thrive. Thrive will provide spay/neuter and medical services to the community. Thrive has asked to have some changes made to the space and we are working through the City's processes to get that

work done.

- Pet Food Pantry was held on November 14 and November 21. On November 14, there were 294 pets served at Chesterfield Square, 101 pets served at East Valley, and 86 pets served at North Central for a total of 481 pets served. On November 21, there were 233 pets served at Chesterfield Square and 310 pets served at East Valley, and 56 pets served at North Central for a total of 599 pets served.

Public Comment was made by:

- **Heather Michaels** - asked how the Department plans on keeping the numbers down for the canine influenza and asked about the spay/neuter clinic at North Central.
- **Gail Raff** - asked for an update on the dog named Hennessy and a report back on the Department's protocol for animals that come into the shelter that need emergency care.
- **Whitney Smith** - spoke about the discrepancies regarding the canine influenza.

6. BOARD REPORTS

A. Pets Belong with Families Act (Information Item)

Staff Assistant Legislative Correspondent Dahvi Cohen from Congressman Adam Schiff's office provided an overview on H.R. 5828, Pets Belong with Families Act, which would prohibit pet restrictions on public housing based exclusively on breed.

Public Comment was made by:

- **Heather Michaels** - is in support of this act.

B. Private Veterinary Care Programs (Information Item)

GM Dana Brown provided an update on the Department's Private Veterinary Care Programs. The Department contracts with private veterinary hospitals in order to obtain care for shelter animals. The Special Treatment and Recovery (STAR) fund provides medical treatment to severely injured, abused, and neglected animals who are referred by veterinarian staff. A maximum of \$3,000 per animal must be adhered to. A contractual agreement has been approved by the city attorney to begin using the STAR funds. Eighteen animals have been taken out on the STAR Program; 14 have completed treatment and four are still under treatment.

The Good Samaritan program is used for animals who come into the shelter an opportunity to see a private veterinarian and allows persons or organizations who are willing to pay for the critically needed medical care. This program is for animals that do not belong to the City of Los Angeles.

Public Comment was made by:

- **Gail Raff** - stated that when animals come into the shelter and cannot be treated, they need to be sent out for treatment.
- **Heather Michaels** - stated this is a great way for the Department to work with the rescues and the community.
- **Whitney Smith** - stated that the Good Samaritan program is for animals that belong to the Department.

SUBJECT: RECOMMENDATION TO SUPPORT H.R. 5828 – PETS BELONG WITH FAMILIES ACT

BOARD ACTION RECOMMENDED:

1. **SUPPORT** H.R. 5828 (Schiff) – Pets Belong with Families Act; and
2. **AUTHORIZE** staff to transmit this recommendation to the Mayor and City Council for consideration of adoption in the form of a Resolution by the City Council with the concurrence of the Mayor.

BACKGROUND:

In November 2021, Representative Adam Schiff introduced H.R. 5828 which would prohibit public housing agencies from imposing breed restrictions on household pets owned by residents of dwelling units in public housing, and for other purposes. This includes public housing tenants in need of stable and safe homes, who face unnecessary stresses from blanket pet restrictions on breeds considered to be “dangerous.”

More than 70% of residents in an inclusive housing survey said that pet friendly housing is difficult to find and 59% reported that pet friendly housing is too expensive. As a result, these families are forced to either surrender their pets to animal shelters, or choose potentially unsafe or unstable housing in order to keep them. This bill would overturn breed specific restrictions and would remove overly broad and unfounded barriers for residents of public housing without overriding local jurisdictions or private housing restrictions.

This bill is endorsed by the The Humane Society, American Bar Association, American Veterinary Medical Association, American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA), Michelson Center for Public Policy, Best Friends Animal Society, and the American Kennel Club.

SUMMARY:

The Department recognizes the importance of animal companionship and that pets are an indispensable part of the American household. The Pets Belong with Families Act would remove these overly-broad and unfounded barriers for residents of public housing, ensuring that no one is forced into housing instability because of an unnecessary breed ban.

- Pets are not just a friendly face that greets us when we get home – they’re cherished members of our families.
- Even science shows us pets can help us stay healthy physically, mentally, and emotionally.

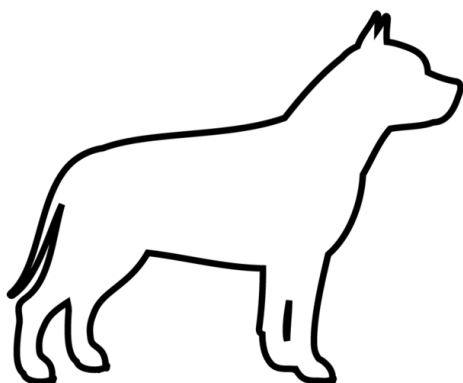
- This includes public housing tenants in need of stable and safe homes, who face unnecessary stresses from blanket pet restrictions on breeds considered to be “dangerous.”
- These restrictions unfairly target pit bulls and rottweilers – or dogs that simply resemble these breeds – regardless of more than twenty years of data showing that calculating bite rates for specific breeds is virtually impossible.

Restrictions on breeds don’t make communities safer for people or pets

- Prominent organizations, including The Humane Society, American Bar Association, American Veterinary Medical Association, and American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, have research demonstrating that such bans fail to enhance public safety.
- The CDC strongly recommends against breed-specific laws, noting that data collection related to bites by breed is fraught with potential sources of error.

Breed-specific restrictions exacerbate housing insecurity

- These restrictions target low-income pet owners who should not be forced to choose between their beloved pets and stable and secure housing.
- More than 70% of residents in an inclusive housing survey said that pet-friendly housing is difficult to find, and 59% reported pet-friendly housing as too expensive.
- At their worst, breed-specific restrictions force families to either surrender their pets to animal shelters at a cost to taxpayers or choose potentially unsafe or unstable housing.



THE SOLUTION:

The *Pets Belong With Families Act* would remove these overly-broad and unfounded barriers for residents of public housing- ensuring that no one is forced into housing instability because of a unnecessary breed ban.
